## TROUT SEASON OPENS IN N. J.

Anglers Prepare to Flock to Streams—Prospects of Full Strings Are Bright

Elmer, N. J., April 1.—Trout fishermen opened the season in New Jersey today when they flocked to inland streams and lakes to cast their flies for the wary brook, brown and rainbow trout. The open season, which also includes salmon, ends July 15.

The trout fishing offers the first spring sport for the rod and line enthusiasts. The season for pike and pickerel does not open until May 20, and that is followed by the season for black, calico, rock and white bass, crappie, pike, perch, pike, white and yellow perch and trout, opening June 15.

Except where winter floods broke through the banks of ponds and lakes in some parts of South Jersey and let the game fish escape, most of the popular haunts of the anglers give promise of a seasonable sport. The absence of recent heavy rains has permitted the streams and waterways to clear, and sportsmen say that the trout should be hungry and ready to rise greedily.

Trout fishing has become popular in South Jersey inland water courses in recent years, through the efforts of the State Fish and Game Commission in "planting" large numbers of fish.

The Jersey fish and game laws fix a limit of twenty-five trout or ten salmon a day for individual anglers, and fish taken out must measure six inches.

## TRYING TO BREAK CORNER IN STUTZ

New York Stock Exchange Bars Dealings in Motor Company's Stock

New York, April 1.—In taking the first step toward breaking the corner which has existed on the New York Stock Exchange in Stutz Motor Co. shares, the governing committee of the exchange yesterday unanimously voted in favor of a resolution under which all members of the exchange are prohibited temporarily from dealing in Stutz stock, either on the floor, in their offices, or in any other circumstances.

This means that no member of the exchange may execute an order in Stutz Motor for a customer until the ban has been lifted, without putting himself in a position where he may be severely disciplined.

When the announcement was made that the exchange had prohibited its members from dealing in this stock, a great hue and cry immediately went up that dealings in Stutz would be transferred to the curb market today, and those in with the Stock Exchange trading restrictions eliminated, it would shoot up like a skyrocket. This hope of those who would like to see such an exhibition was quickly dashed to earth by E. R. McCormack, president of the New York Curb Market Association, who announced that no member of the association would be permitted to deal in Stutz in the open market. He said that non-members trading in the outside market were, of course, not subject to the rules of the association. No announcement has come from the Consolidated regarding what action it will take, but it was said last night it will not be traded in on that exchange either.

## KILLS HER FIVE CHILDREN

Mother Then Tries Suicide and Recovery Is Doubtful

Elk City, Okla., April 1.—With their heads crushed and their throats cut, five small children of Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Cowart were found dead yesterday in a tent in which they had been making a temporary home three miles south of here. The wife and mother lay beside the children with her throat slashed. An ax, razor and butcher knife, all blood-stained, were found in the tent.

Screams of the children attracted a man plowing a field nearby, but all the children were dead before he reached the tent, and the mother had succeeded in slashing her own throat.

## REPORT VETERANS "WET"

Association's Questionnaire Shows Beer and Light Wines Favored

Washington, April 1.—Former service men are in favor of legislation permitting the sale of light wines and beer, according to a statement issued by the headquarters of the Rank and File Veterans' Association here.

A questionnaire sent out to thirty-eight states shows the service men of all but two states in favor of light wine and beer, the statement declared. The replies to the questionnaire also show the veterans opposed to universal military training and favoring a bonus, paid for by taxation of excess profits.
