

VERSO UN ACCORDO PER L'ADRIATICO?

La Soluzione Dello Scabroso Problema si Crede Prossima a Raggiungersi

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Parigi, 1 aprile.—Belgrado ha accolto con entusiasmo la notizia circa le dichiarazioni di amicizia fatte dall'On. Nitti verso la Jugoslavia e c'è da ritenere che la speranza nelle Delegazioni Italiana e Jugoslava, a Parigi, che una soluzione sul problema Adriatico possa essere presto raggiunta.

A. Trumbic, ministro per gli affari esteri jugoslavo, è stato chiamato a Belgrado per interefferenza politica, ma ha posposto la sua partenza da Parigi per un gran giorno nella speranza di avere una conferenza col Ministro Italiano Scialoja, ex-ovo prima di Pasqua.

Tanto gli Italiani che gli Jugoslavi di qui sono convinti che i diretti negoziati tra le due nazioni debbono essere preferiti, prima per avere probabilità di successo e poi perché cancellerebbero ogni possibile attrito tra le due nazioni, attrito che sarebbe inevitabile se la soluzione fosse lasciata ad una commissione arbitraria. Discutendo la situazione il rappresentante della Jugoslavia a Parigi, oggi ha detto:

«Come l'On. Nitti ha dichiarato, l'Italia e la Jugoslavia hanno tutto da guadagnare da una amicizia. Noi abbiamo una larga quantità di farina e legname pronta per essere esportata in Italia ad un prezzo molto minore di quello se dovessero essere importata da altre nazioni. Del resto nessuno scambia possibile se prima la questione Adriatica non sia risolta.»
