

Anti-Suffragists Rejoice : Mask and Wig Club Rehearses : Moving Day, but No Place to Go



THE DELAWARE LEGISLATURE yesterday defeated the suffrage amendment, which was followed by an ovation for the lawmakers from the anti-suffragists of the state. At the left is that "president's smile of victory." She is Mrs. Henry B. Thompson, president of the "Antis" in Delaware. The center picture shows from the left, Representative Joseph B. Lord, who voted against the amendment, being congratulated by Miss Charlotte Rowe, an Anti. Mrs. Thompson has the right hand of Representative James E. Lloyd, after she had placed a red rose on his coat. Mrs. H. I. Beers has his left hand. She later presented him with the bunch of roses she is holding. At the right is Representative W. E. Hart, who introduced the bill in the House, and was reported to have been "kidnaped" on Tuesday. He says he wasn't.

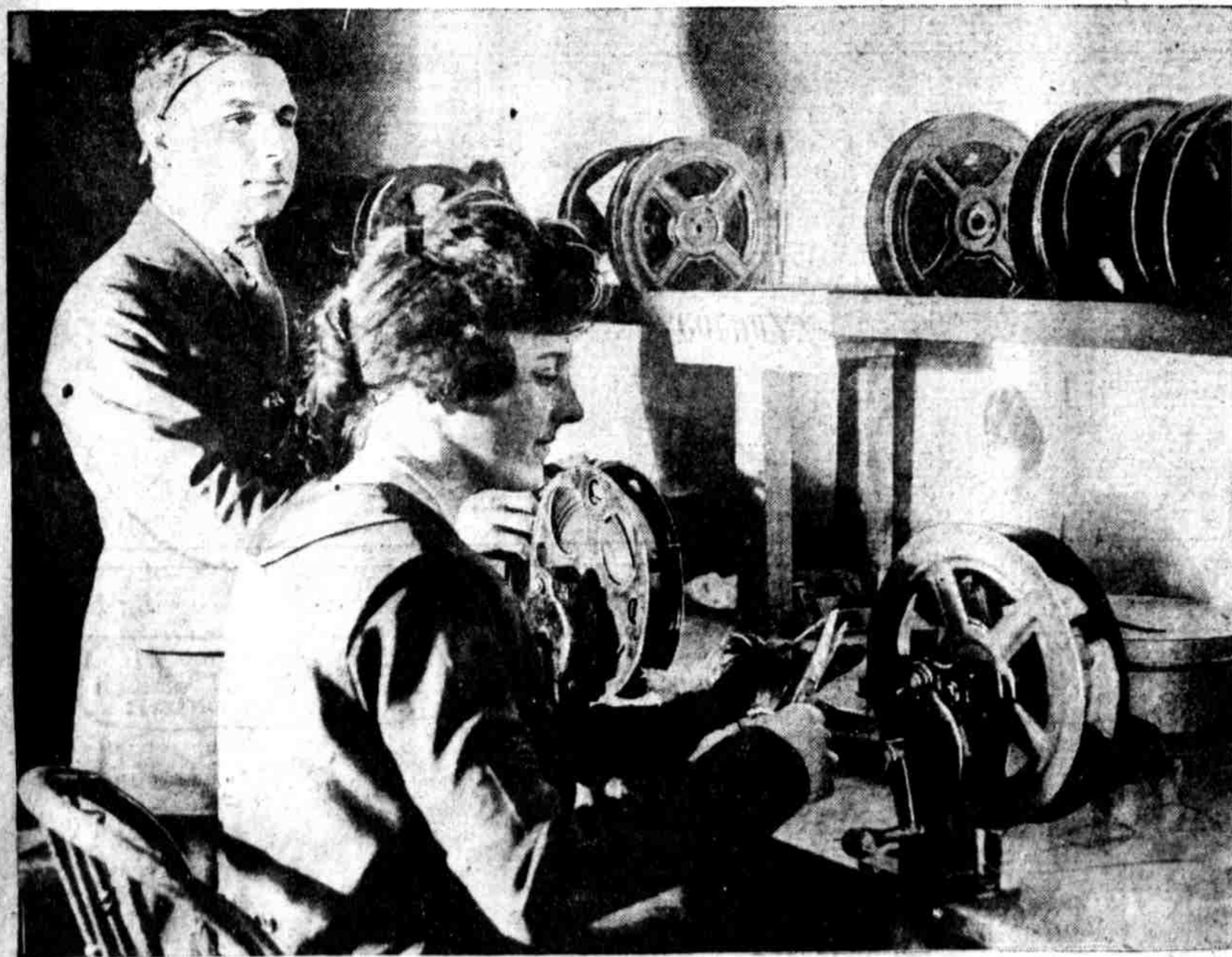

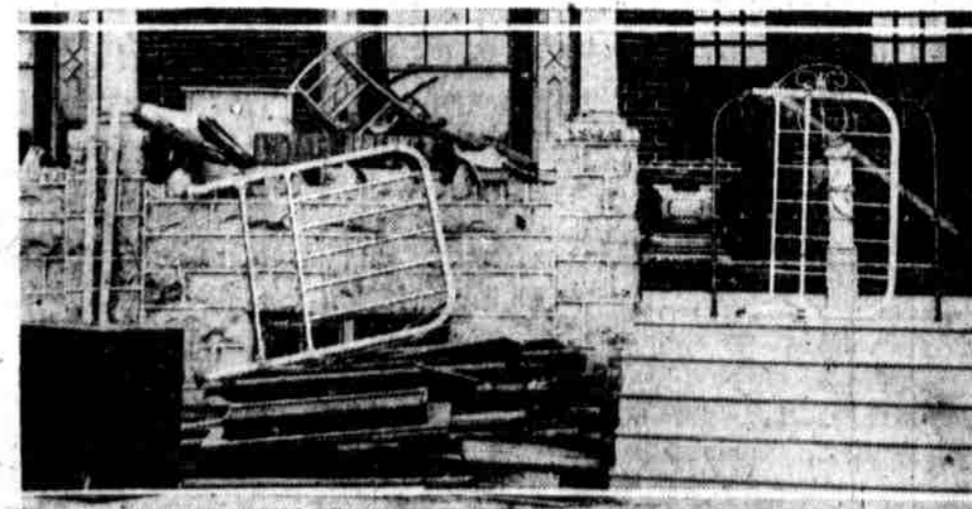
