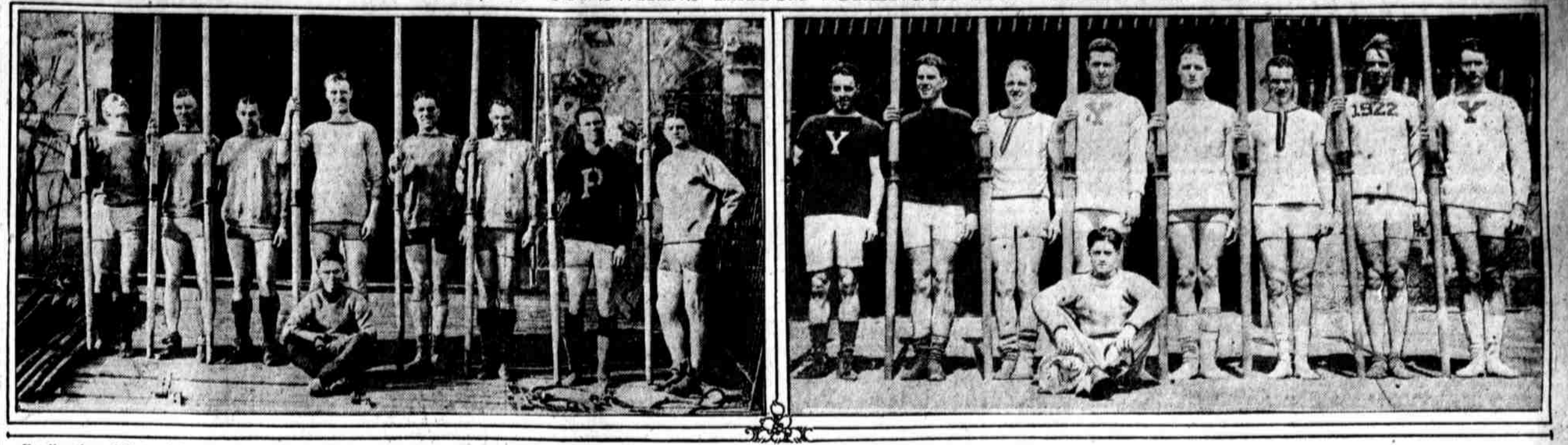
Will Define Cage Title Tonight
