From 1909 to 1919, a period of ten years, Boston and Philadelphia together collected ten pennants and no less than eight world championships.

The Athletics won premier honors in 1910, 1911 and 1913; the Red Sox in 1912, 1915, 1916, 1918; the Braves in 1914.

These two cities ruled the game for a decade. And now, facing the 1920 campaign, they are listed in a battle for last place in both leagues.

In the National, last place is booked as a battle between the Braves and Phillies.

The game has never known a more amazing shift. For it is about a century that either a Boston or a Philadelphia club will take last place by storm and hold it against all assaults in both leagues.
