A., and also to play in the British amateur championship at Muirfield. In addition he will play on the American cam against the English collegians.

Gardner broke the news through the redium of the Yale News that Grant Peacock, who was beaten on the thirty-seventh hole in the second round of the national at Oakmont by George Hoffner, and Nelson Whitney, several time southern champion, have already accepted the invitation of the U.S. G. A. to join the team.
