

**FIREMAN INJURED  
IN WAREHOUSE FIRE**

Blaze at Spinning Mill Does \$5000 Damage Before It Is Checked

**MAN FALLS FROM LADDER**

One fireman was injured and \$5000 damage done by fire yesterday in a warehouse of the Delphi Spinning Mill Co. at Rose Hill and Clearfield streets.

Isadora Weiss, thirty-one years old, of engine company No. 31, fell from a ladder, and was taken to the Episcopal Hospital. He was later taken home. The fire was discovered at 11:45 o'clock. It originated in the rear of the one-story building. By the time firemen had arrived the flames were sweeping through the building and bursting from the roof. A large quantity of yarn fed the flames and made a heavy smoke, which drove the firemen back. The building was isolated from the main factory of the knitting company. The fire was not controlled until 1:30 o'clock.
