

L'ITALIA RAFFORZA IL BLOCCO DI FIUME

Gabriele D'Annunzio Minaccia l'Occupazione Della Costa Sulla Baia di Quarnero

Trieste, 28 aprile.—Il blocco di Fiume ora più severo che mai, da parte delle truppe regolari italiane e le comunicazioni con la città sono state completamente interrotte. Tutte le sezioni delle linee ferroviarie sono sorvegliate dalle predette truppe, le quali, armate di mitragliatrici, guardano anche le frontiere. A nessuna persona è permesso di entrare o uscire dalla città di Fiume, come pure neanche a coloro che trasportano il latte. Le comunicazioni dalla parte del mare con il resto del mondo sono state tagliate. Gabriele D'Annunzio, comandante dei volontari che occupano Fiume, minaccia una contro-azione. Ad un corrispondente che lunedì fu

in Fiume, parlando riguardo la situazione, D'Annunzio avrebbe così dichiarato: "Le mie forze di terra, di mare ed aeree sono pronte per occupare la costa della baia di Quarnero, compresa Abbazia e Volosca, se i soldati di Nitti continueranno i loro atti ostili a mio riguardo. Essi impediscono il rifornimento dei viveri per le donne ed i bambini della città, ma essi troveranno che tale atto brutale non abbatterà lo spirito dei miei soldati e marziali trionfanti."

San Remo, 27 aprile.—Si apprende che l'Italia abbia ottenuto vantaggi economici in Siria e Mesopotamia, ove si possono ricavare grandi profitti con i lavori ferroviari nelle sorgenti del petrolio e nelle miniere. L'On. Nitti sarebbe riuscito ad ottenere il controllo della produzione del carbone ad Eraclea. Il distretto però rimarrà sotto la sovranità turca, che l'On. Nitti garantisce di mantenere intatta riservandosi di affidare il mantenimento dell'ordine alla polizia italiana. Data la mancanza di carbone in Italia, l'acquisto delle miniere di Eraclea ha una importanza eccezionale. La soluzione del problema Adriatico, che i Primi Ministri erano ansiosi di risolvere, fu dovuta rimandare in seguito all'appello rivolto al Consiglio Supremo dal Ministro per gli Affari Esteri Jugoslavo, Dottor Trumbic. Questi con un telegramma al Consiglio esprimeva il desiderio che il Consiglio stesso non raggiungesse una soluzione da imporsi alla Jugoslavia, che potesse turbare i rapporti futuri tra i due paesi. Nello stesso tempo dichi-

arava esplicitamente di giungere ad una intesa con l'Italia. Dietro consenso di Nitti la proroga fu accordata.

Port Workers Seize Russian Ships Paris, April 28.—(By A. P.)—Two merchant vessels flying the Russian anti-Bolshevik flag, which were anchored in the harbor of Genoa, were seized yesterday by members of the Federation of Port Workers, who announced they took over the vessels for the purpose of returning them to the Russian soviet government. The police interfered and arrested those who had boarded the vessels.

WANT DIVORCE MADE EASIER New Legislation Proposed Modifying English Law London, April 28.—(By A. P.)—Legislation modifying England's divorce laws will be urged at the present session of the House of Commons. The government, it is contended, will in that event be morally bound to facilitate the passage of a measure which will sanction divorce on the following additional grounds: Wilful desertion for three years, cruelty, lunacy, habitual drunkenness and committed death sentences. Names of prominence in the social world figure in another heavy list of

suits to be heard in the divorce court during the coming term, and of the 1288 cases on the docket 1243 are undefended. In the latest list Lady Katherine de Vere Somerset, daughter of the Duke of St. Albans; Viscountess Torrington, Sir William Willoughby Williams, the Honorable G. E. Cholmondeley and Mrs. Sherwood-Kelly appear.

Alfonso's Wireless Phoning Fails Seville, Spain, April 28.—(By A. P.)—King Alfonso has attempted to use the wireless telephone in communicating with King George, of Great Britain, but failed. The Marconi wireless telephone system installed on William Marconi's yacht, the Electra, did not function properly.



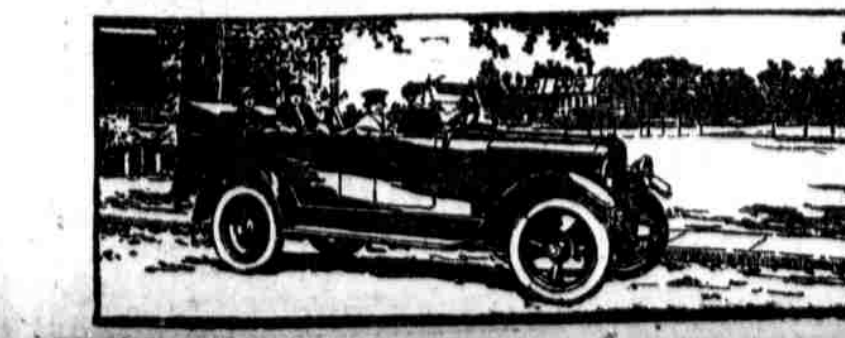
