MARKET PENDULUM AGAIN DOWNWARD. Prices Sink to Lower Levels as Selling Pressure Against the List Increased. New York, May 3.—For the fifth consecutive Monday the New York market has been sinking steadily. There was nothing particularly disturbing about the day's trading, but the over-all movement was downward. The only adverse influence was the disappointing bank statements. This indicated a continuation of the tight money market, in so far as stock-market accommodations were concerned, for some time to come. The stringent money market conditions, however, were already known and therefore could hardly be held responsible for the further wide-spread of the bearish market sentiment.

LACK OF SUPPORT IN CURB MARKET. Stocks Break Abruptly Under Moderate Offerings. Oils Firmer.

New York, May 3.—Some of the stocks traded in the Broad Street curb market reflected a demoralized trading position, breaking abruptly under moderate offerings and finding little support, even when disastrous disclosures occurred. General Asphalt attracted most attention, yielding from 75 to 68. There was pressure against the Carb issues, which may have been due to fears that a change in the Mexican government might interfere with the rights of that company in Colombia. The packing stocks were also heavy, although the downward movements in those issues were more moderate than in the other weak features. The petroleum stocks acted in a firmer manner than the industrials, some of these issues being in good demand, with a brisk demand for Dominion Oil. Houston Oil ranged from 90 to 87. White Oil was steady with sales at 26 to 25. Oklahoma and Texas Petroleum—out of the lowest priced issues, was in good demand.

LAKE SUPERIOR UNDER PRESSURE. News of New Canadian Steel Combination Partly Responsible for Fresh Liquidation. All other movements and developments in the local market were completely overshadowed by the renewed news liquidation in Lake Superior. From the outset the stock was held passively, suggesting urgent selling of speculative marginal accounts. Impacted by the recent drastic change in the larger market, the business of selling apparently was also provoked by the announcement of the new Canadian steel combination, which, it was feared, would seriously cut into the business of the Lake Superior Corporation. The stock for a considerable part of the time was absolutely without support, which resulted in a further decline to 14 1/2, a new low for the movement and the lowest since 1918. Around midday supporting orders were sent in which stayed the downward movement and raised the quotation fractionally above the lows.
