

### MAN SUFFOCATED IN LANDMARK FIRE

William Penn Hotel in West Phila., Built Century Ago, Damaged by Blaze

### SON OF PROPRIETOR DEAD

After a fire which damaged the William Penn Hotel, 3811 Market street, had been extinguished last night, James P. Lynch, twenty-nine years old, son of the proprietor, Thomas J. Lynch, was found dead in bed in his room on the third floor. His death was due to suffocation.

Lynch's father believed that his son had gone to a theatre. Discovery of the young man's body was made by Patrolman James J. Cassidy, of the thirty-ninth street and Lancaster avenue station.

It was believed that Lynch still had a chance for life and he was sent to the Presbyterian Hospital. Physicians failed to revive him.

All the horses in the stable adjoining the hotel were saved by Fred Bur-

roughs, an employe, and several stablemen.

### WHARTON SCHOOL CHANGES

Research Course Made Compulsory. Finance Department is Divided. Several important changes will be made in the curriculum of the Wharton School of Finance and Commerce of the University of Pennsylvania, according to an announcement by Dean Emory R. Johnson, made coincident with the appearance of the school catalogue for the year 1920-21.

The most important provision is that which requires every senior to take and complete satisfactorily before graduation a course in research. Assistant Professor A. G. White has been appointed director of research and will have charge of the seniors in this particular line of work. The purpose of this provision is to see that every graduate secures a certain amount of practical field, or laboratory, experience and knowledge in the particular subject in which he is specializing.

The Department of Finance has been divided into three departments and the courses formerly given under that department will be found under one of three new departments—accounting, finance, or merchandising—according to the subject with which they deal.

### SHIP BRINGS IN MENAGERIE

Six monkeys and a dozen canaries formed part of the "cargo" of the American steamship Eagle, which docked here after a 23,000-mile voyage during which it circumnavigated the globe. This menagerie is composed of

trophies of the trip. The monkeys were captured in Africa and the birds near the Panama canal. The monkeys are now thoroughly domesticated and capable of many tricks taught them by the crew. They showed dislike for the birds, and it was necessary to keep them apart.

The vessel, in command of Captain Charles M. Hayward, left New York for the Orient November 27. From the Suez canal on April 10 the Eagle cleared for Philadelphia by way of the Straits of Gibraltar. The vessel's cargo is chiefly petroleum.

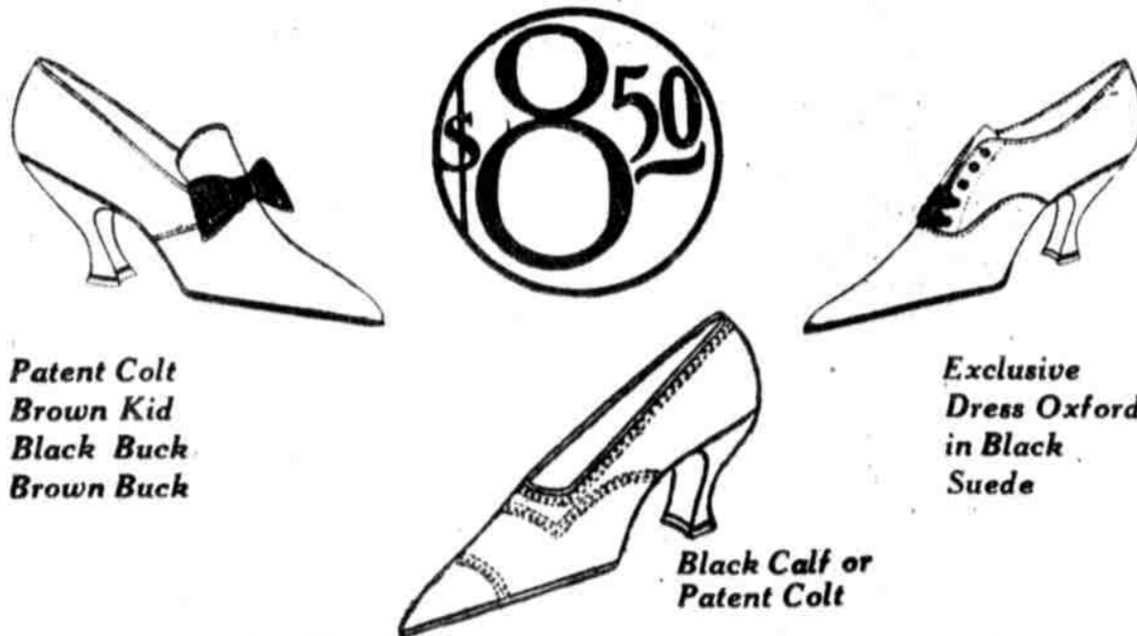

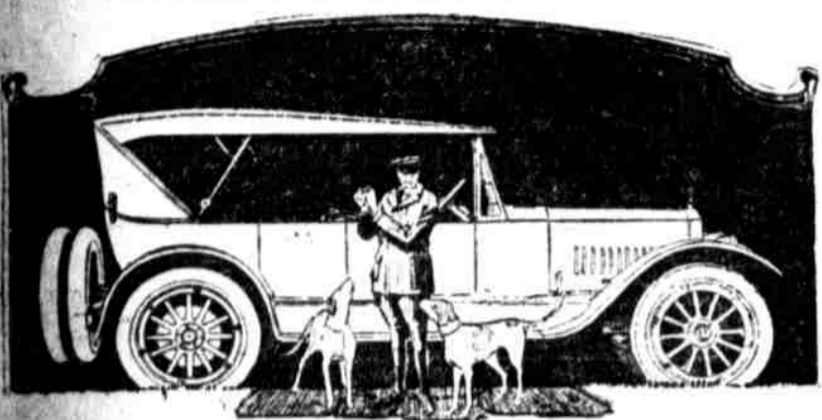
