 London, May 17.—The troops of General von Luettwitz have again marched into Cottbus, sixty miles southeast of Berlin, and the workers

three have declared a general strike, according to a Berlin dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph.

Berlin, May 17.—The Morgen Post says that a warrant for the arrest of General von Luettwitz, who was leader of the military arm of the recent Kapp revolutionary dictatorship in Berlin, on a charge of high treason, has been is-

sued by the examining judge of the Leipzig Supreme Court.

According to a news agency, the existence of a widely ramified communist plot, hatched in a Berlin suburb, for sabotage during the elections, for the Reichstag by organized attacks on the polling booths and the destruction of ballot-boxes and ballots.

tended Mrs. Francy, and with the aid of other passengers made her as comfortable as possible. The conductor attempted to persuade the woman to be treated at a local hospital and held up his train for several minutes in the hope that she would do so.
