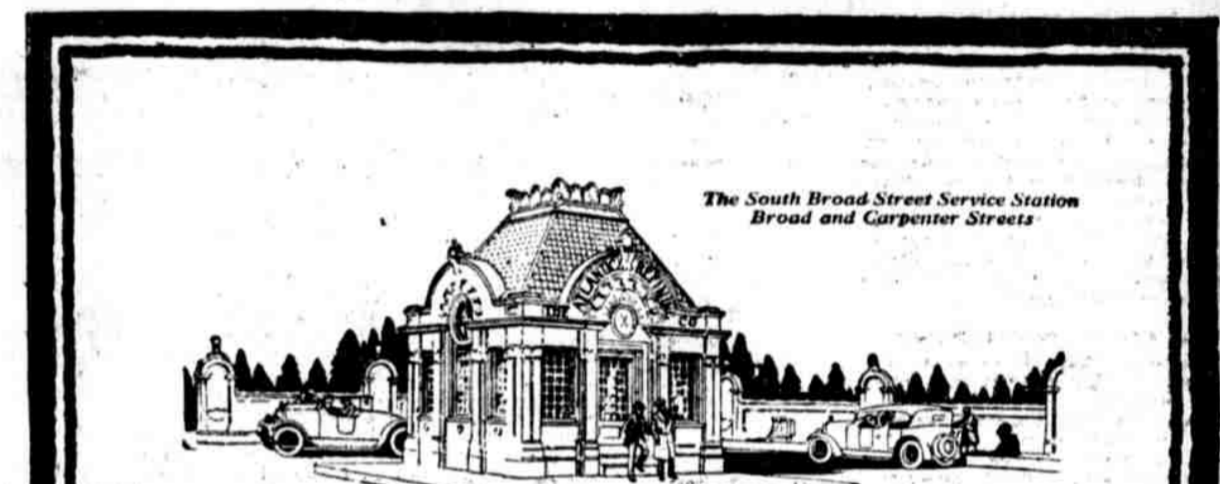

WOOD LEADS IN NEW JERSEY

John Wood appears close second in G. O. P. Presidential Primary. Trenton, May 19.—The presidential primary election returns, as canvassed by the secretary of state and announced today, showed Wood received 52,900 votes as the Republican party candidate for choice for President and Johnson twelve. The Democratic delegation is solid for Edwards.
