In the fight for delegates-at-large to the Republican national convention, the administration forces swept the city, and latest returns indicate that the supporters of Senator Penrose will elect all their delegates in the state.

Mayor Moore defeated Receiver of Taxes W. Freehold Kendrick, the Vares candidate, by 1408 majority in the city, with nine divisions still missing.

Governor Sproul received the second largest vote here for delegate-at-large. His total in this city reached 131,190.
