The flames were discovered shortly before midnight. Mrs. Widoff was awakened by the sound of crackling wood. This was followed by smoke pouring into her bedroom from the hallway.
 Thinking of the safety of her children first, Mrs. Widoff groped her way to their rooms at the rear of the house. She carried two of them to a front window and then aroused the others. Escape by way of the stairway was impossible, as it was completely enveloped in flames.
