From Quebec your journey is down the romantic St. Lawrence towards the sea, stopping at charmingly situated Murray Bay and Tadoussac at the foot of the Laurentian Mountains, where are located Canada Steamship Hotels, with golf links, salt water swimmingpool, etc. Leaving Tadoussac you begin the journey up the glorious Saguenay with its stupendous Capes, "Trinity" and "Eternity," higher than Gibraltar. The return journey is via the same route, stopping at all the points visited on the trip from Niagara.

You can arrange your trip on the Company's steamers so as to stop off a day at the important points, without having to worry about hotel accommodation.

Look at the map. You can begin your journey at Niagara Falls, Rochester, Toronto, Alexandria Bay, Montreal or Quebec, and return the same way, arranging your trip on the steamers so as to stop off a day at the important points, without having to worry about hotel accommodation.
