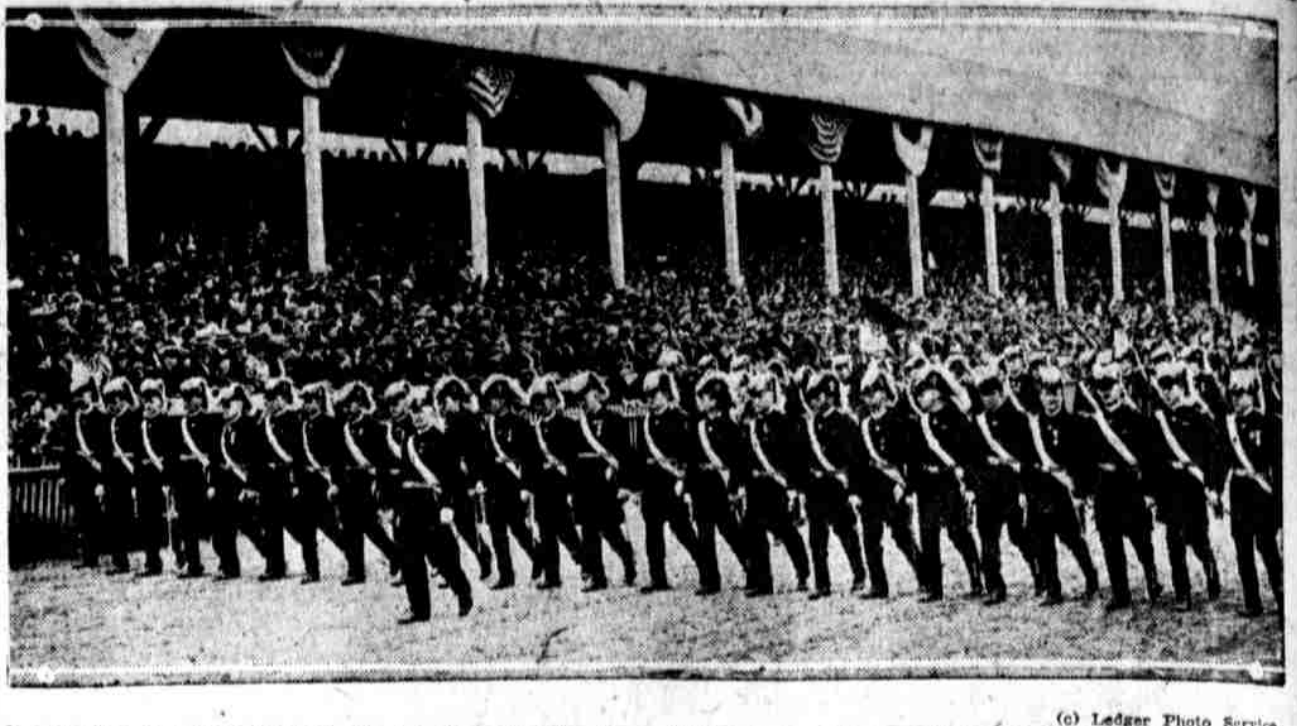

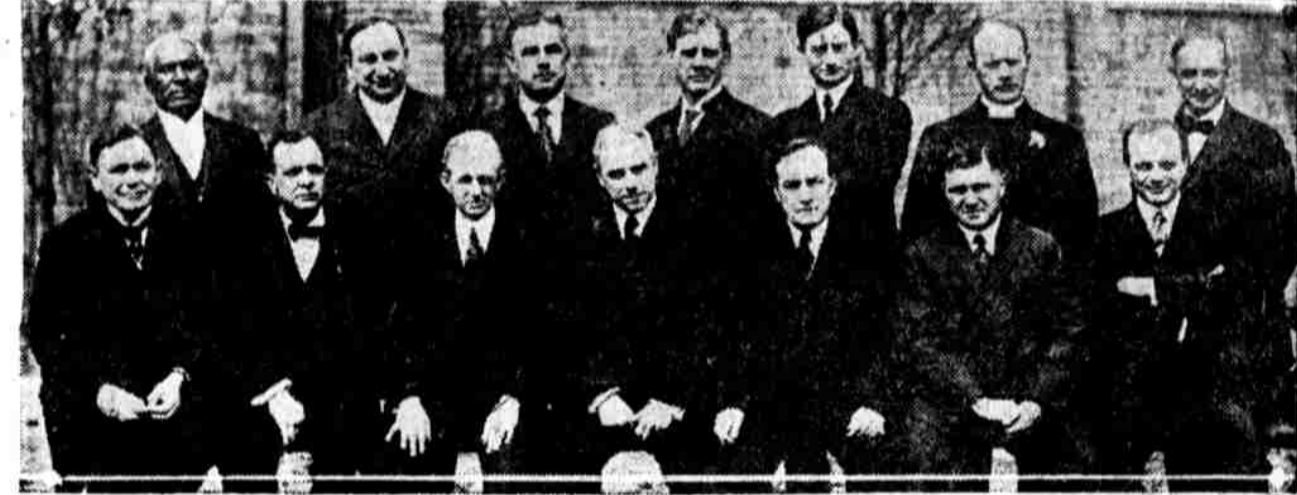

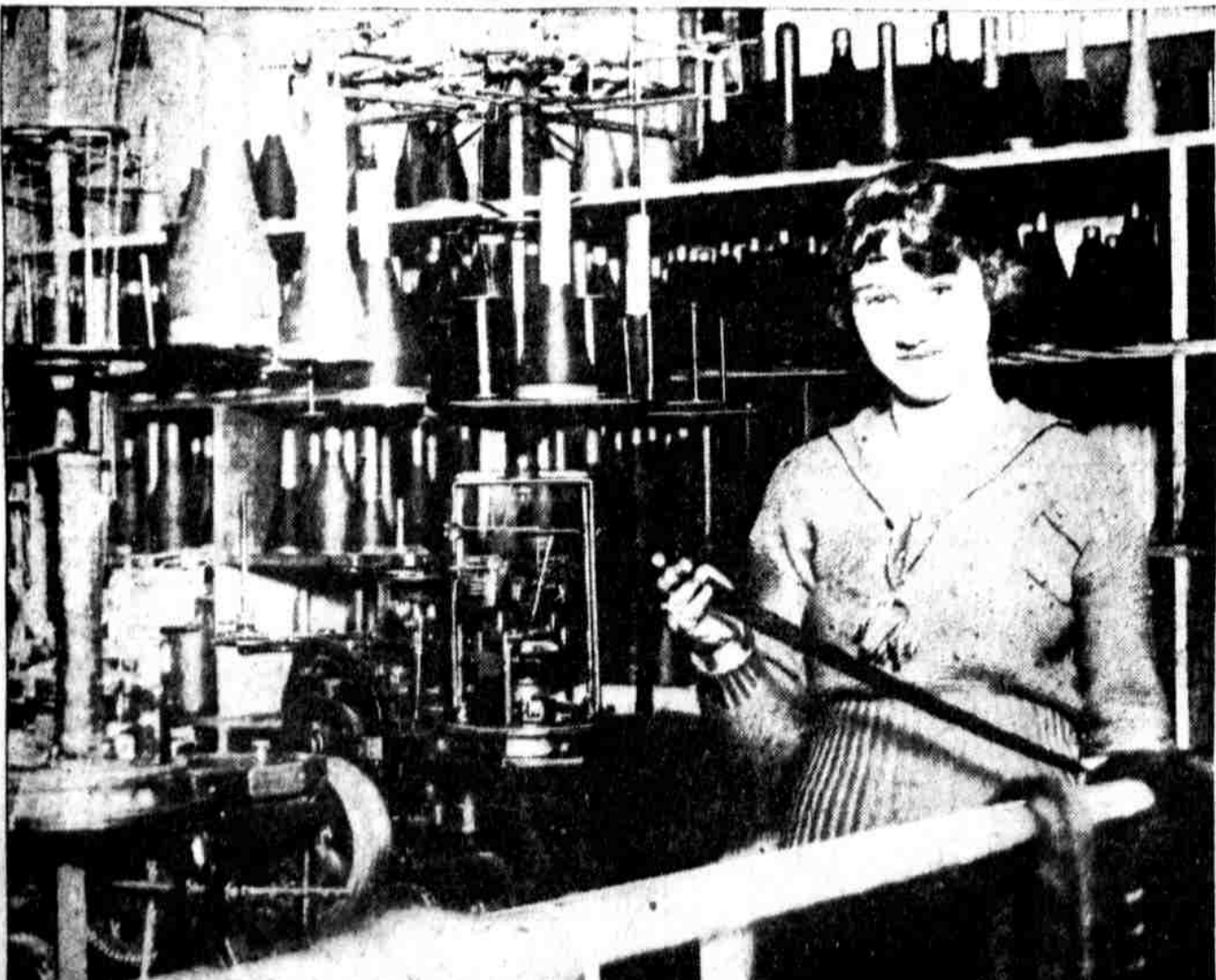

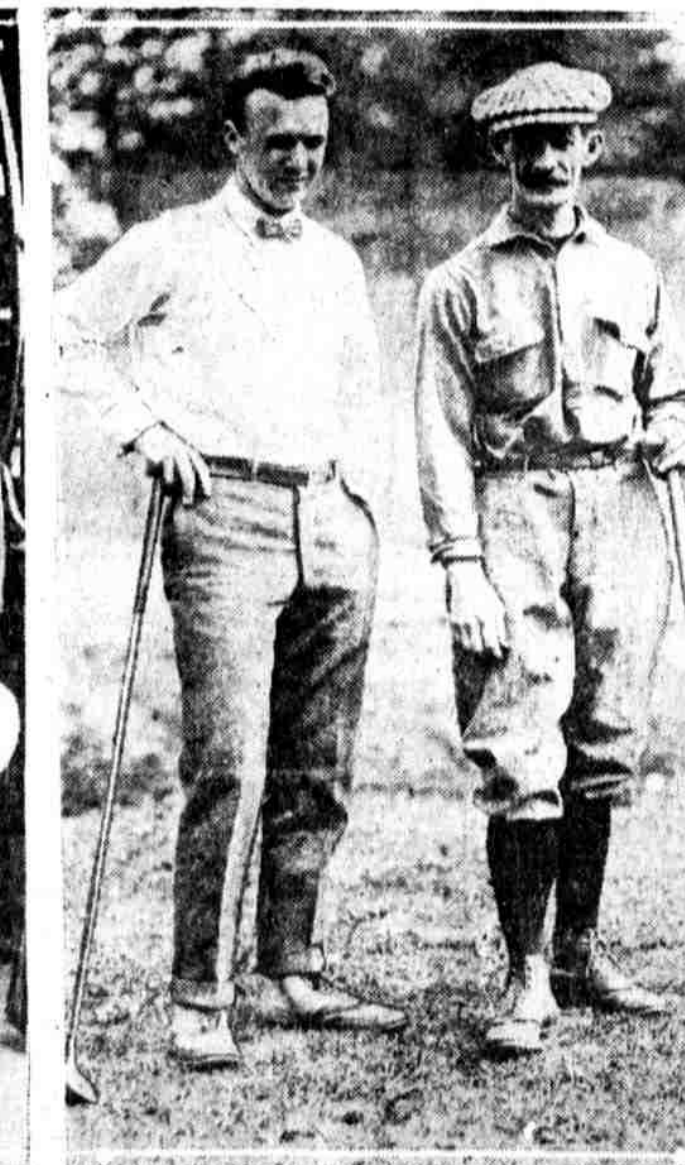
OUR CITY'S WORKERS AND WHAT THEY DO
