

GIRL SLAYER CONVICTED

María Tucci Faces Penalty of Ten to Twenty Years
New York, May 28.—(By A. P.)—Miss María Tucci, aged twenty, tried on a charge of first degree murder for the shooting of her sister, Mrs. Angelina Conti, on March 8, was found guilty last night of manslaughter in the first degree. The jury reported its verdict after being out eleven hours and a half. Sentence will be imposed June 7. The shooting occurred in an East Side apartment in which the sisters resided. The prosecution alleged that the shots were fired by Miss Tucci after her sister claimed the shooting was in self-defense. The law provides a penalty of ten to twenty years' imprisonment for conviction of manslaughter in the first degree.


