

# CYNWYD CAPTURES INTERCLUB TITLE

Tilden and Pearson Only Germantown Victors in Final Tennis Series

Even W. T. Tilden, 2d. national finalist, national indoor champion, North and South title holder and the No. 2 man on the Davis Cup team, could not prevent the Cynwyd team from winning the interclub tennis championship at the Germantown Cricket Club yesterday. Tilden was in fine form and defeated Wallace F. Johnson, of Cynwyd, a national semifinalist, in a hard four-set match. Tilden walked away with the first set, 6-2, but Johnson evened matters up by winning the second, 6-3. Tilden then proceeded to take the next two sets by identical scores, 6-4.

Stanley W. Pearson, the former national squash racquet champion, kept up the good work for Germantown by defeating G. C. Shaffer after dropping the second set.

But there the Germantown victors ceased, for Carl Fischer and Dr. P. H. Hawk both won their matches and the two doubles also went to Cynwyd.
