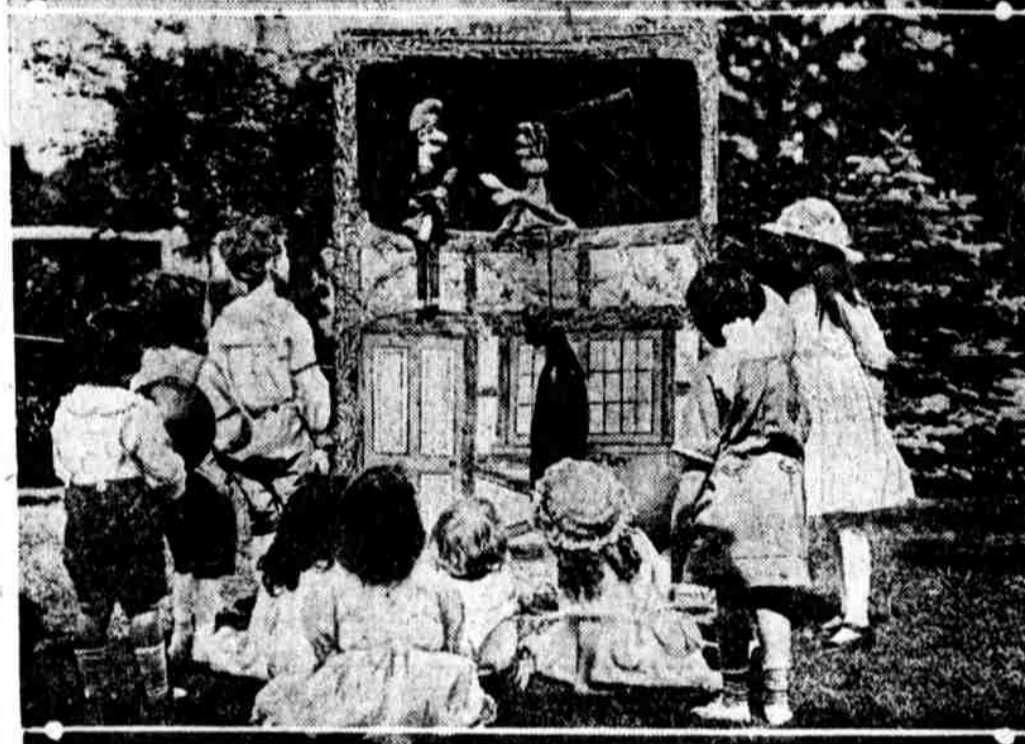

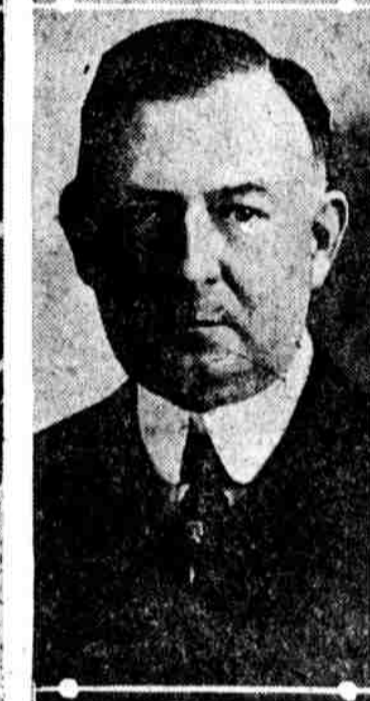
MISS ELIZABETH HOOD LATTA, attired in a Colonial outfit, was in the fashion review.

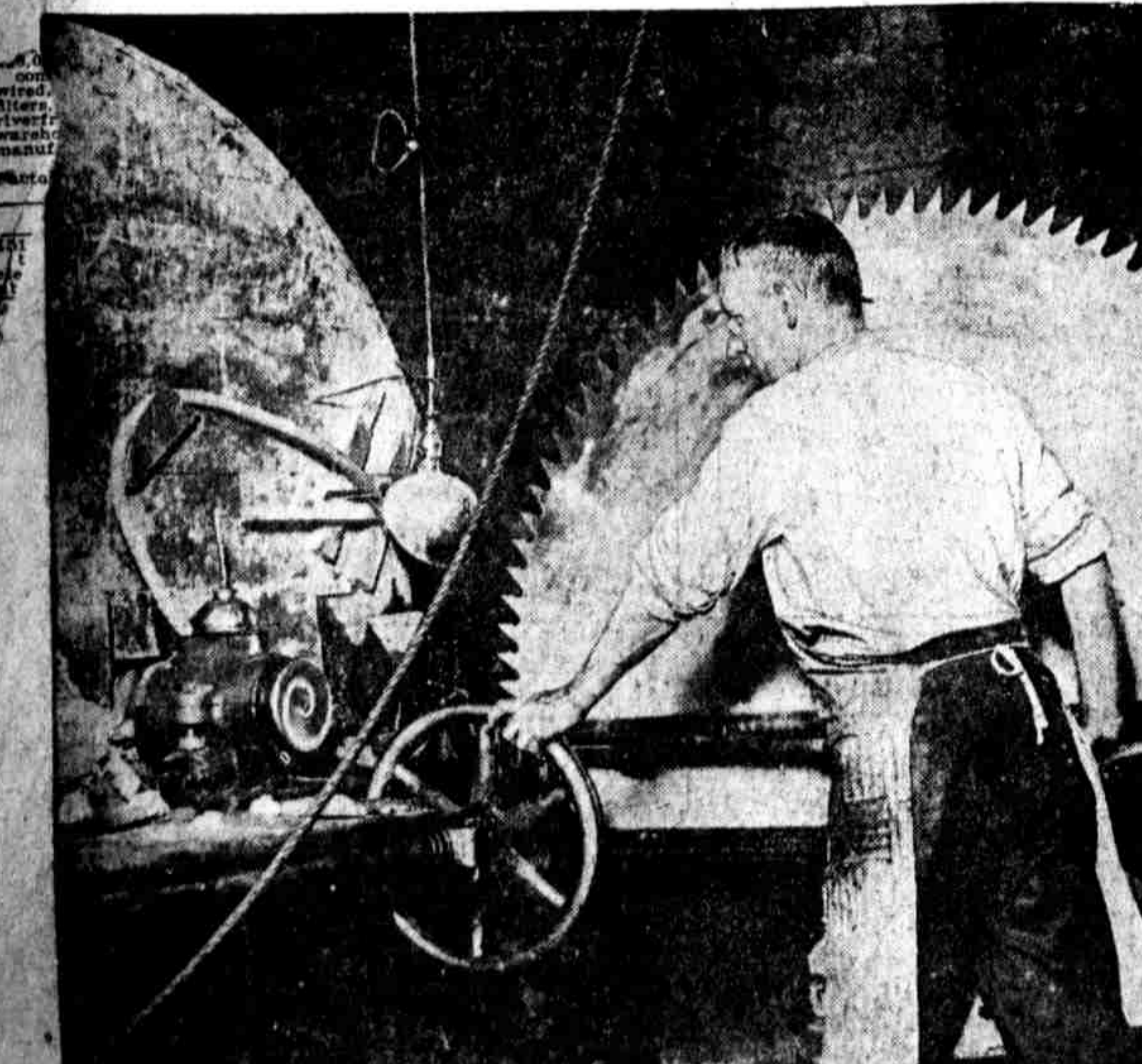
