Versailles, June 4.—The treaty of peace with Hungary was signed in the Grand Trianon Palace here at 4:25 o'clock this afternoon.

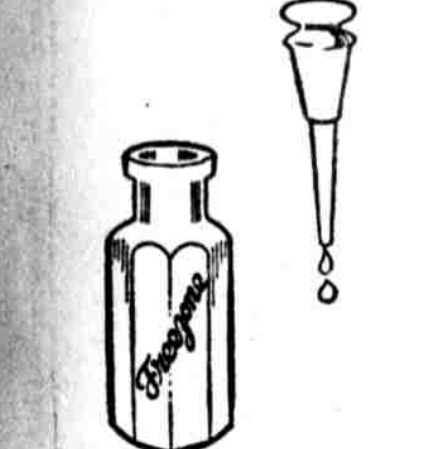

to the signing of the peace treaty. Several small disturbances already have occurred.
It is rumored that former Premier Stephan Friedrich, who has violently opposed signature of the peace treaty by Hungary, has new plans under cover in connection with his opposition.
Count Albert Apponyi, former head of the Hungarian peace delegation, today expressed his belief that the disorders were only sporadic and that conditions soon would improve. All necessary precautions have been taken to prevent the hotbeds from revolting.
Twelve army officers are in a hospital as a result of having been pierced by poisoned needles, and a number have died from the same cause. These outrages are committed at night when officers are going about on duty, and particularly when they are in the crowds.
