IT WAS A busy day for Helen Taft. She was besieged by hundreds, who congratulated her on her engagement to Frederick Johnson Manning.

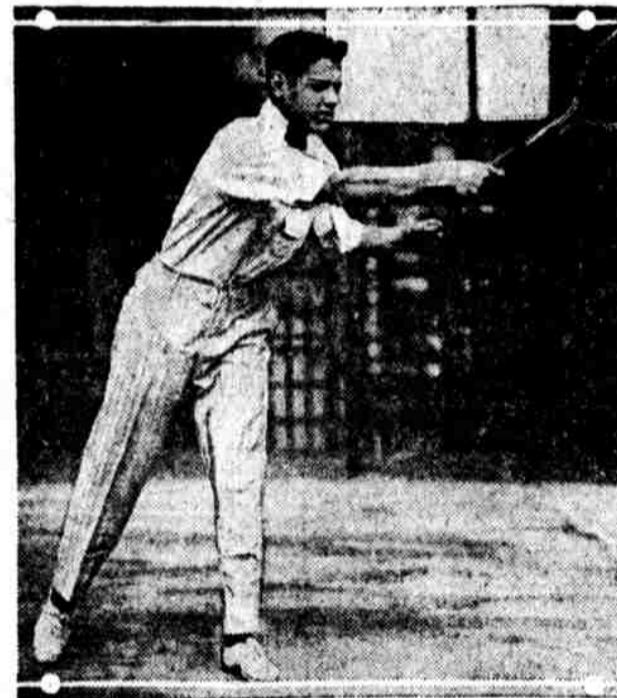

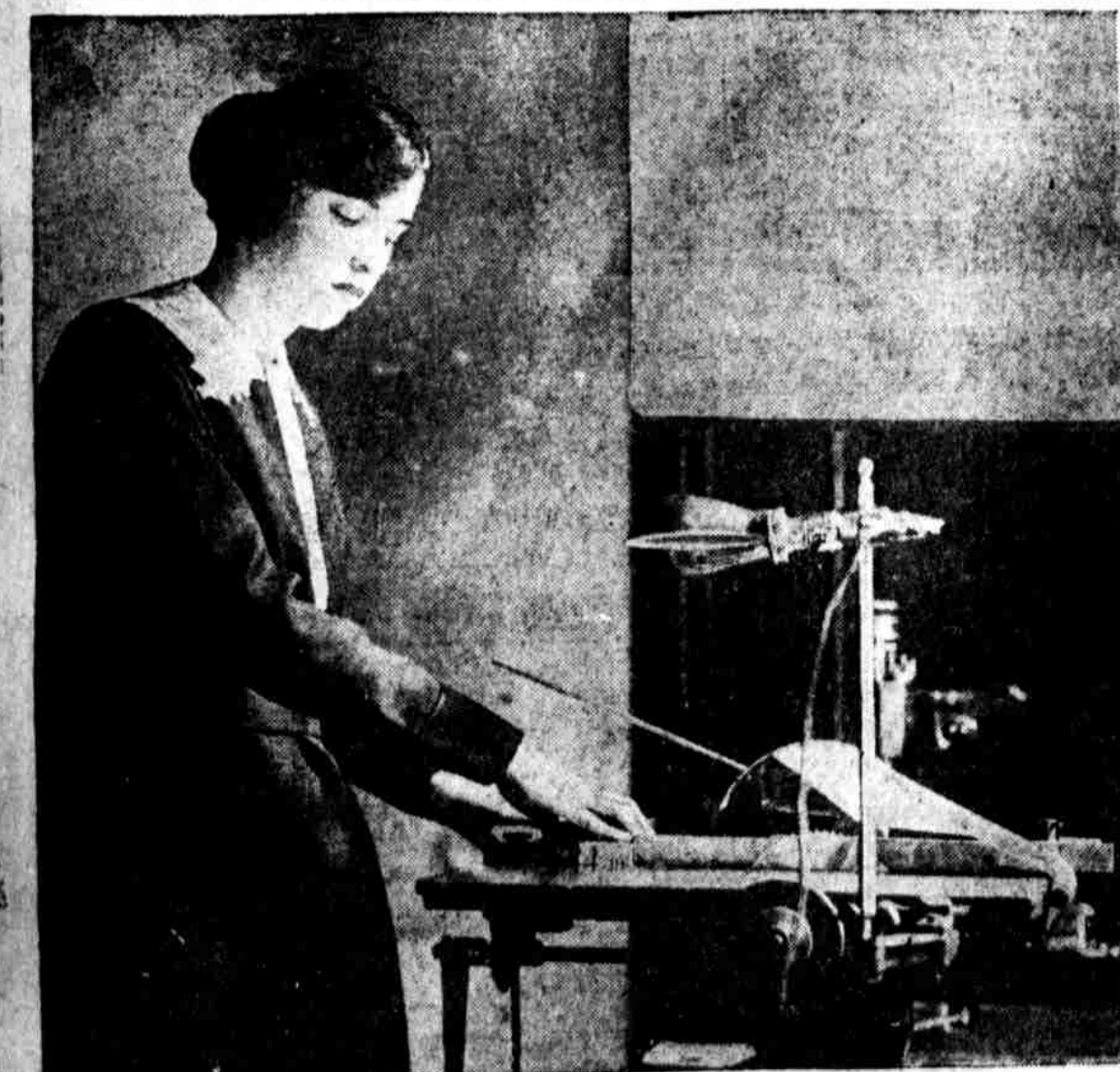
