

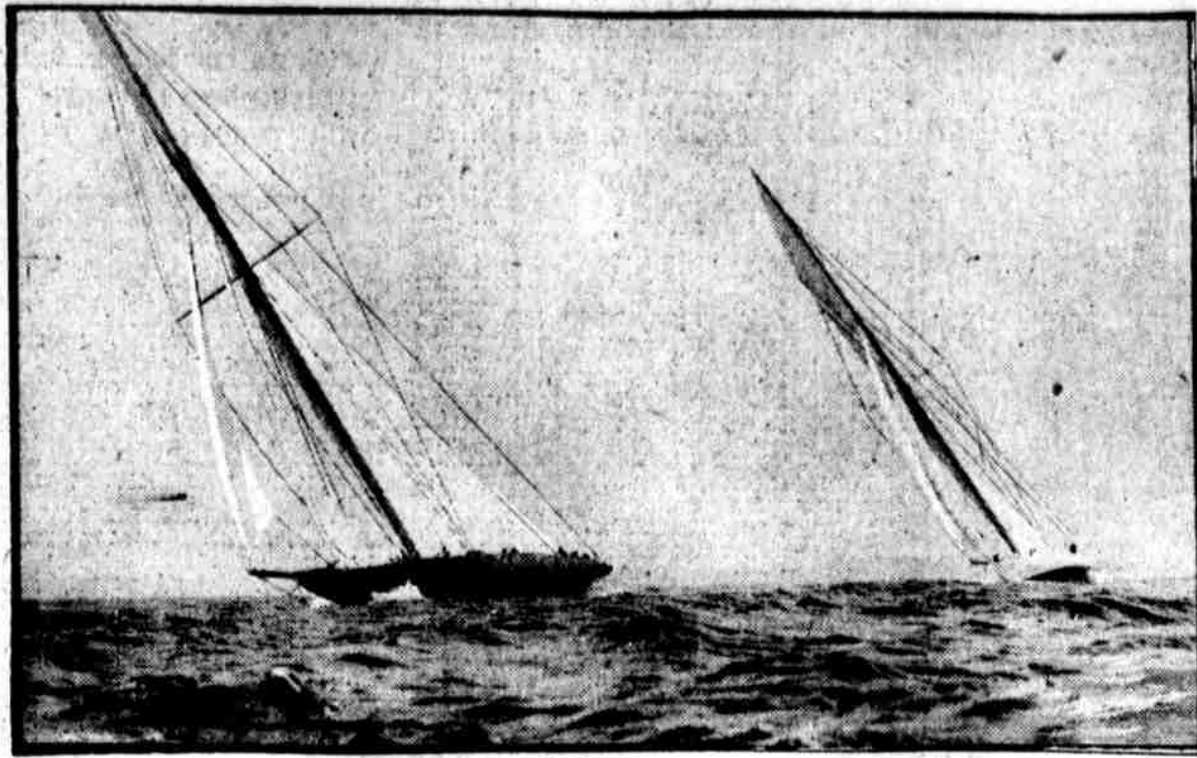

Every distance runner of note from Chicago to New England has entered and a field of seventy runners is expected to face the starter.
