"The debt of the Belgian Government
in 1914 was approximately $943,000,
000, of which only $58,000,000 was
external debt. The major part of the
funded debt was in the form of 3 per
cent perpetual bonds. The long period
of peace which Belgium had enjoyed
enabled the state to devote a large part
of the proceeds of its borrowings to
public improvements, and its invest-
ment before the war in railways, tele-
phones and telegraphs approximated
$600,000,000. In the ten years prior
to 1914 the net return of railways,
telegraphs, telephones, post offices and
other investments averaged about 90
per cent of the total interest charges
on the debt of the Belgian Government.
For this period the interest and sinking
fund charges on the total government
debt, if the net return from state utili-
ties and investments had been applied
to such charges, would have required
on the average only 13 per cent of the
remaining net government revenues.

ment credit."
