

7 PERSONS HURT AS CAR HITS AUTO

Realty Dealer, Taking Family to See House, Drives in Front of Trolley

Seven persons were badly injured last night when an automobile in which they were riding was struck by a trolley car at Bling Sun avenue and I street. The automobile was driven by Lawrence Webster, of Southampton, Bucks county. He was driving north on Bling Sun avenue and attempted to cross in front of the car, which was going in the same direction. The injured were taken to the Franklin Hospital. Physicians said this morning that the condition of all, with the exception of Webster, was serious. The others injured are: Ralph Hoerner, thirty-three years, 4043 North Warsaw street, lacerations and cuts of the face and hands; Mrs. Ralph Hoerner, thirty-five years old, fractured skull, fractured right arm, serious condition; Helen Hoerner, ten years old, fractured skull, internal injuries, serious condition; Bert Hoerner, seven years old, lacerations of scalp, fractured right leg, left arm torn; Fred Hoerner, nine years old, lacerations of head and back; Warren Hoerner, eleven years old, lacerations and contusions of face. Webster is a real estate agent, and was taking the Hoerner family out to see a house on the outskirts of the city. Passengers in the trolley car escaped injury.

ESCAPING GAS BURNS GIRL

Accident Is Caused by Spark From Crossed Electric Wires. Rose Bell, sixteen years old, of 2300 Cross street, was burned about the face and arms last evening when a spark from the loose ends of electric wires exploded gas escaping from a nearby pipe. Two wires had been left hanging from the ceiling near a gas pipe in a corner of the room when electricians who were wiring the house quit for the day. An odor of escaping gas later in the evening caused Rose to mount a stepladder to investigate, and in some manner the wires became crossed, emitting the spark that caused the explosion. A fire alarm was turned in, but no damage was done. The girl refused to be taken to a hospital and was treated at a nearby drug store.
