BLOC IN MINORITY

Majority Socialists, Centrists and Democrats Combined Have Only 222 Seats

OTHER PARTIES TOTAL 238

By the Associated Press Berlin, June 9 .- Unofficial reports from Sunday's cleetion show that the Majority Socialists, Centrists and Democrats, who, by combining, dominated the last session of the German Parliament, will be in the minority in the new republican Reichstag. These parties, according to indications, have only 222 seats, while the seats of other parties total 238.

Including the deputies from plebiscite districts who retain their National Assembly mandates, the new Reichstag will have 460 members. Latest figures show that 25.719.067 votes were polled.

show that 25,719,067 votes were poiled. Indications are that the seats will be apportioned as follows:

Majority Socialists, 110. Independent Socialists, 80. Centrists, 67. German Nationalists, 65. German People's party, 61. Democrats, 45. Christian Federalists, 21. Guelphists, 5. Bavarian Peasants' party, 4.

Communists, 2. Three Berlin editors have been elect d. They are Otto Hoetzsch, of the Kreux-Zeitung: Reinhold Wuelle, of the Pan-Germanic and of the anti-semitic Norddeutsche Allgemeine Zeitung, both members of the German Na-tional party, and Heinrich Rippier, of the Tacgliche Rundschau, a candidate of the German People's party.


