

THREE HURT BY AUTOS
 Woman and Boy Seriously Injured in Northeast Section
 Three automobile accidents in the northeast section of the city yesterday resulted in the serious injury of two little boys and a woman.
 Edward Denkinson, eight years old, who lives at Elkhart and Livingston streets, while playing in front of his home, was struck by a machine driven by Morris Rojeski, twenty-eight years, Richmond street and Indiana avenue. The injured child in his father's car, drove him to the Northwestern General Hospital and then gave him- self up to the police of the Belgrade and Clearfield streets station. The small boy is suffering from internal injuries.

Grover Davidson, seven years old, 1345 East Somerset street, was struck at Emerald street and Hart lane by a machine driven by Clarence Hanger, twenty-three years, 2101 East Stella street. In this case likewise the driver of the car rushed the child to the Episcopal Hospital and then gave himself up to the police. Davidson has a fractured skull, and hospital authorities say he may die.
 Mary Sterratski, twenty-five years, 4295 Penn street, was run down by an autotruck at Buckins street and Frankford avenue, driven by William Diekel, twenty-five, 1212 East Solgwick street. The injured woman was taken to the Frankford Hospital, where it was said she was in a critical condition, due to four fractured ribs and internal injuries. Diekel was arrested and held under charges of assault and battery by automobile.
