

### 3 HURT IN STRIKE OF LONGSHOREMEN

Union Member Shot and Two Strike-Breakers Injured as Disorders Continue

### MORE POLICE GO ON DUTY

Three men were injured last night as the result of a fight between striking longshoremen and strike-breakers at Moyamensing avenue and Federal street. Following an investigation three men were arrested today charged with participating in the fight. The prisoners are Arthur Coles, Eighth street and Girard avenue; William Dwyer, Seventh and Bainbridge streets; and Leighton York, Fourth and Carpenter streets. Each was held in \$500 bail for court by Magistrate Coward. Although extra precautions had been taken by the police on account of a riot on Wednesday, in which one man was killed, disorder reigned at several points in the river district. The men injured are George Hickman, Third and Thompson streets; Charles Watkins, 1216 Fulton street; and Edward Watkins, his brother, of the same address. All were taken to the Pennsylvania Hospital. Hickman was shot in the right side when strike-breakers who sought shelter in a freight car opened fire on a crowd of strikers who attacked them. Shortly after this attack other strikers assaulted strike-breakers near Thirtieth and Catharine streets. Bricks, clubs and revolvers figured in this fight despite the fact that the police were nearby. The Watkins brothers, who were among others picked out for attack by the strikers, received severe bodily injuries. Extra details of police will be stationed along the river front and around the strikers' headquarters today. Shipping men say that the strike has greatly weakened and more than half of the strikers have returned to work.

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### BANK TO AID FARMERS

Financial Institution Offers to Buy Dairy Cows for Bucks County

For the purpose of increasing food production financial aid will be given farmers of Bucks county by the Solebury National Bank of New Hope, Pa. As a step in this direction the bank has offered to buy registered dairy cows for farmers who desire to improve their herds. Farmers have been requested to notify the bank as to the kind of cows desired; the bank will buy the cattle and accept the farmer's note in payment. R. R. Welsh, of the animal husbandry department of State College, has been engaged to purchase the cows.
