

FORMER ALBANIAN PRESIDENT SLAIN

Essad Pasha Assassinated in Paris by Student Who Calls Him Dictator

Essad Pasha had a picturesque career. Regarded by all the European governments in 1913 merely as an Albanian outlaw, three years later he was recognized by the same powers as provisional president and was minister of Albania following the downfall of Prince William of Wied.

At one time Essad was commander of the army at Constantinople. His brother having been killed by order of Abdul Hamid, Essad conceived a hatred of the sultan which led him, when the Turkish parliament in 1908, upon the deposition of Abdul, to solicit and receive permission to notify the sultan of his downfall and arrest him.

Only a few days ago the Tempo, of Rome, reported an agreement had been concluded between Essad and the government at Belgrade by which Essad would use his influence in Albania in favor of Jugoslavians in return for Jugoslavians to support the Albanian and appoint Essad governor of Albania for life, the administration of the country to pass to Jugoslavians on his death.

PRINCE BREAKS TRADITION

Heir to Spanish Throne Will Become Private Soldier Today

Madrid, June 14.—The Prince of Asturias, heir to the Spanish throne, will take the oath of loyalty today as a private infantryman in the regiment formerly known as the old Third Moravade, which participated in the conquest of Seville in the thirteenth century, and fought with Cortes in Mexico and with Pizarro in Peru.

For the first time in history an heir to the Spanish throne will serve as an ordinary soldier, the others having received the rank of captain general at birth. The prince would have preferred to become a sailor, but his father chose a military career for him.

WARSAW ADMITS KIEV EVACUATION

Bolsheviki Force Poles to Retire to Jitomir—Dnieper Bridges Destroyed

Warsaw, June 14.—The evacuation of Kiev has been completed, the Poles withdrawing to the region of Jitomir. The American Red Cross workers, according to latest accounts, had made preparations to evacuate Kiev with the army.

General Denikin, the Russian commander who fought against Denikin, is bringing up reinforcements, the dispatches say, but the military authorities assert the fight for Kiev is not yet ended by any means.

Before evacuating Kiev, the Poles destroyed the bridges over the Dnieper. London, June 14.—(By A. P.)—Persia's appeal for protection against Russian Bolshevik aggression was expected to be one of the first subjects to be discussed by the Council of Nations at the opening of its executive session in St. James Palace late this afternoon.

In view of the hands-off policy of the council with regard to the Polish offensive, it is considered by some observers of the trend of affairs that the Persian situation raised a problem almost impossible for the council, as considered at present, to solve.

General Smigley's retreat before the Bolsheviks in Ukraine has been executed in perfect order, according to army headquarters here. The advance of the Bolsheviks upon Chernobyl forced the retreat.

In Polesia the Russians lost severely while trying to break the Polish front against the Bolsheviks. Under cover of artillery fire reached the right bank of the Dnieper, but were cut off and annihilated. Two hundred Polish prisoners and many were drowned.

There is intense activity in the region of Lake Selo and to the northward. Before evacuating Kiev, according to a Bolshevik communique, the Poles blew up the Vladimir Cathedral, the railway stations, the electric power station and the aqueduct. Destruction of the last, the communique says, doomed the population to the horror of epidemics.

Taxing of Monasteries Discussed

Madrid, June 14.—The question of taxing monasteries and convents in Spain was the subject of a long conference yesterday between Minister of Finance Pascual and Cardinal Gulasas, archbishop of Valladolid. Hitherto religious institutions have been free from taxation, but they have been included as taxpayers under the recent financial measures.
