

### CITY MOVIES TO AID VETERANS OF WAR

Welfare Department Sends Out List of Organizations That Help Service Men

Under the supervision of Director Ernest L. Tustin, department of public welfare, a campaign will be promoted for the benefit of world war veterans among the former service men's and welfare organizations.

A list of the locations and activities of the various organizations is being distributed.

This list follows:

Bureau of War Risk Insurance, third floor, northwest corner Broad and Cherry streets, Spruce 6510—Allotment and allowances, compensation and insurance.

Federal Board for Vocational Training, third floor, northwest corner Broad and Cherry streets, Spruce 6101—Vocational training for disabled ex-service men.

United States Public Health Service, tenth floor, northwest corner Broad and Cherry streets, Locust 4902—Medical care of claimants of both the Bureau of War Risk Insurance and of federal board for vocational education.

Pennsylvania State Employment Ser-

vice, 1519-21 Arch street, Spruce 3044—Employment.

American Legion county committee, headquarters Room 329, 1011 Chestnut street—Interested in all problems of all ex-service men.

Home Service Section, American Red Cross, 1007 Walnut street, Locust 6400—Takes care of all disabled ex-service men. Also able-bodied men, discharged less than six months. General information department; family work; casual department.

Knights of Columbus, southwest corner Broad and Vine streets, Locust 5041—Employment department, general information department; school for ex-service men; amusements for ex-service men, patients of the United States Public Health Service and federal board for vocational education.

National Catholic Council (Benedict Club), 157 North Fifteenth street, Spruce 4207—Accommodations, such as rooms, cafeteria, etc. Also meeting place for various posts of the American Legion.

Salvation Army (Service Men's Hostel), 705 North Broad street, Poplar 3428—Accommodations, such as rooms, meals, entertainments, etc.

War Camp Communities, 1417 Locust street, Locust 4596—Furnishes amusements for both disabled ex-service men and able-bodied service men.

Young Men's Christian Association,

1421 Arch street, Locust 2800—Free membership to ex-service men; employment department; scholarships to able-bodied men; legal counsel; accommodations of all kinds, such as rooms, swimming pool, entertainments, etc.

Young Men's Hebrew Association, 1616 Master street, Poplar 5926—Employment department, entertainments for sick men, use of clubroom for American Legion meetings.

Young Women's Christian Association, 1800 Arch street, Locust 1500—Care of war brides.

### MOTHER AND SON RESCUE 3 AT FIRE

Boy, Ten, Aids in Saving Two Children From Suffocation in Burning Home

Bravery of Mrs. Frank F. Eiseman and her ten-year-old son, Jacob, saved three children in the family from probable death by suffocation at their home,

1323 Northeast Boulevard, last night. While Mrs. Eiseman was putting the children to bed fire started in the kitchen. It was caused by the flame of a gas range igniting a pile of clothing. Clouds of smoke rolled through the lower rooms and up the stairway. Rushing to a front bedroom, where she had just placed a two-week-old baby in her crib, Mrs. Eiseman carried the child to the hallway. She then picked up Harriett, a two-year-old daughter, and with a child in each arm started down the stairway. Twice she was driven back by the smoke.

Jacob threw a blanket around his mother and the two children, and with great difficulty Mrs. Eiseman reached the street. She and the children were taken to the home of neighbors.

After seeing his mother and little sisters out safely, Jacob Eiseman then aroused Ethel, his six-year-old sister,

and managed to carry her down the stairway.

A neighbor summoned the firemen by telephone. They confined the flames to the first floor. The fire caused several hundred dollars damage.

A great Chicago packer was informed by one of his division sales managers that their toilet soap was not moving off the dealers' shelves in Texas and the Southwest. The market there was overstocked.

"That's easy—stop shipments for ninety days," was the snappy answer.

Here, if you please, we have one way of stimulating demand, i. e., curtail supply.

Another way is the method of the Raisin Growers' Association of California.

Three years ago the per capita consumption of raisins was one pound.

By advertising, the growers increased consumption (before prohibition) to three pounds per capita.

By advertising, our Chicago packer could have increased the consumption of his toilet soap or of his cheaper cuts of meat, if he so desired.

This method has been established beyond question in practice, not only by the Raisin Growers, but by many growers' associations and manufacturers.

However, an advertising campaign to influence a nation's habits must be continued steadily for years.
