

STATE WILL AUDIT FRICK INVENTORY

Personal Property's Value Said to Be \$25,000,000 More Than as Filed

PRINCETON IS BENEFITED

Pittsburgh, June 18.—The state of Pennsylvania will make an independent audit of the Henry Clay Frick estate because, it is said, the inventory filed with the register of wills here, which places the value of the personal property at \$77,500,000, is \$25,000,000 short of the actual value.
