

# AMERICA WILL JOIN LEAGUE, SAYS TAFT

Will Approach Question Calmly After What Happens on March 4

## REPUBLICAN PARTY PLEDGED

 Baltimore, June 18.—Speaking at a dinner given here last night by the Maryland branch of the English Speaking Union of America, at which he and Sir Auckland Geddes, British ambassador, were guests of honor, former President William H. Taft said that America could not escape the League of Nations and that the league would be adopted after the "obscuring limelights" of the election had been dimmed.

"The war brought us new responsibilities, new burdens," Mr. Taft said. "It is natural, therefore, that we should be slow in adjusting ourselves to these new conditions."

"I tell you, my friends, that we are going to join that League of Nations. We can see a gradual leading in toward the league. After the next election, we shall find ourselves endorsing the league. When on March 4 that thing is going to happen which we hope in the kindness of providence will happen, we will approach this question calmly. The Republican party is pledged to an association of nations. This is only another name for league of nations. With reservations acceptable to other nations, we can foresee the establishment of the league."

Mr. Taft concluded his address with these words:

"We are anxious for a solution of England's troubles. We know that we have no right to interfere with England's internal problems."

## COX BOOMERS ASSEMBLE

Ohio Democrats to Visit Governor Before Leaving for Coast Tomorrow  
 Dayton, O., June 18.—(By A. P.)—Democrats from all sections of Ohio began assembling here today preparatory to leaving on special trains tomorrow night for the Democratic National Convention at San Francisco. Sixteen carloads of delegates and supporters of Governor Cox for the Democratic presidential nomination will make up the party.

The Ohio delegates, all of whom are pledged to support Cox, and their friends will parade to "Trail's End," Governor Cox's country home here, late tomorrow afternoon and will be addressed by the governor and Senator Fomenko. They will remain for dinner and will leave Dayton at 8:30 o'clock tomorrow evening.

Governor Cox will not accompany the Ohio delegation. Instead, he will remain in Ohio, spending most of his time at his desk in the State House at Columbus.

## HARGEST SUCCEEDS KUNKEL

Deputy Attorney General Appointed Judge of Dauphin County  
 Harrisburg, June 18.—(By A. P.)—William M. Hargest, of Harrisburg, deputy attorney general since 1919, and one of the active members of the Dauphin county bar, today was appointed judge of Dauphin county to succeed the late Judge Kunkel. He will assume office immediately.

The new judge was one of the organizers of the State Bar Association and has served as the Pennsylvania member of national commissions on uniform state laws for years and on a similar commission of the American Bar Association. He is an expert in estate tax cases.

Judge S. J. M. McCarrell, who became presiding judge upon the death of Judge Kunkel, is critically ill.


