

By the Associated Press Baltimore, June 18 .- Speaking at a linner given here last night by the Maryland branch of the English Speaking Union of America, at which he and Sir Auckland Geddes, British ambassador, were guests of honor, former President William H. Taft said that America could not escape the League of Nations and that the league would be adopted after the "obscuring limelights" of the election had been dimmed.

"The war brought us new responsibilities, new burdens," Mr. Taft said. "It is natural, therefore, that we should be slow in adjusting ourselves to these conditions.

be slow in additions. new conditions. "I tell you, my friends, that we are going to join that League of Nations. We can see a gradual beading in toward the league. After the next election, after we look at the subject calmly, we shall find ourselves indorsing the league.
