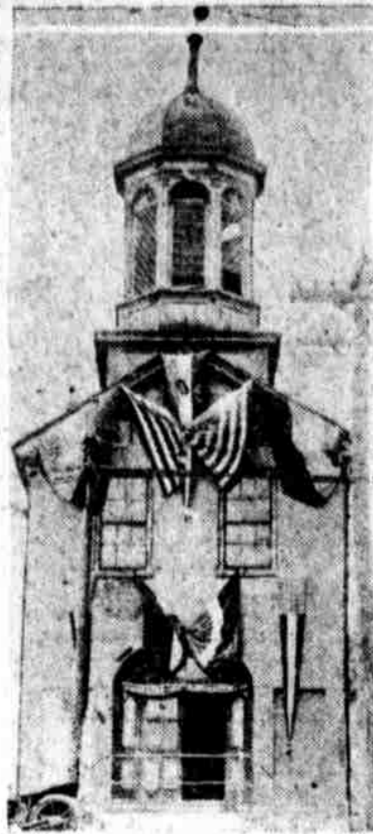




Two "SAILORS" who will appear in the historical pageant. They are Miss Marion Hillings (left) and Miss Alice Yates



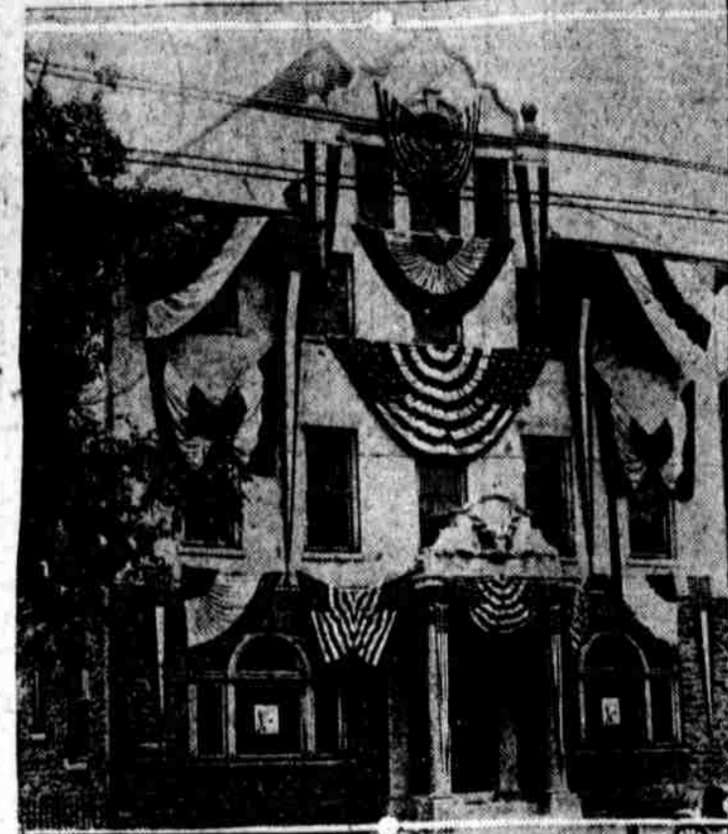
BRISTOL'S OLD TOWN HALL. This old-time structure was for many years the headquarters of Bristol's borough officials

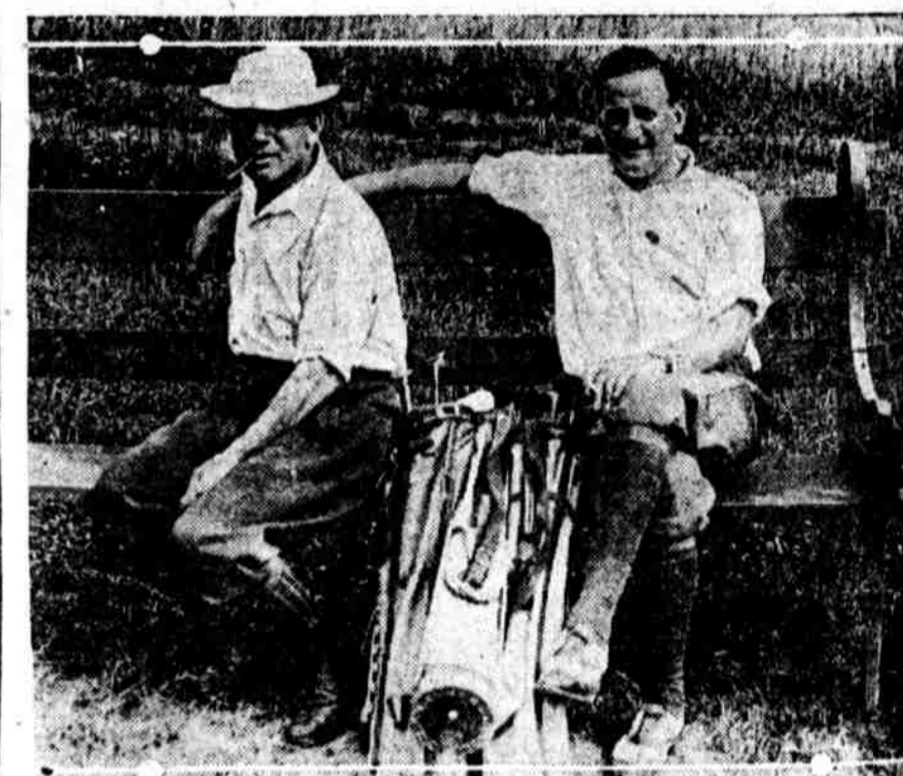

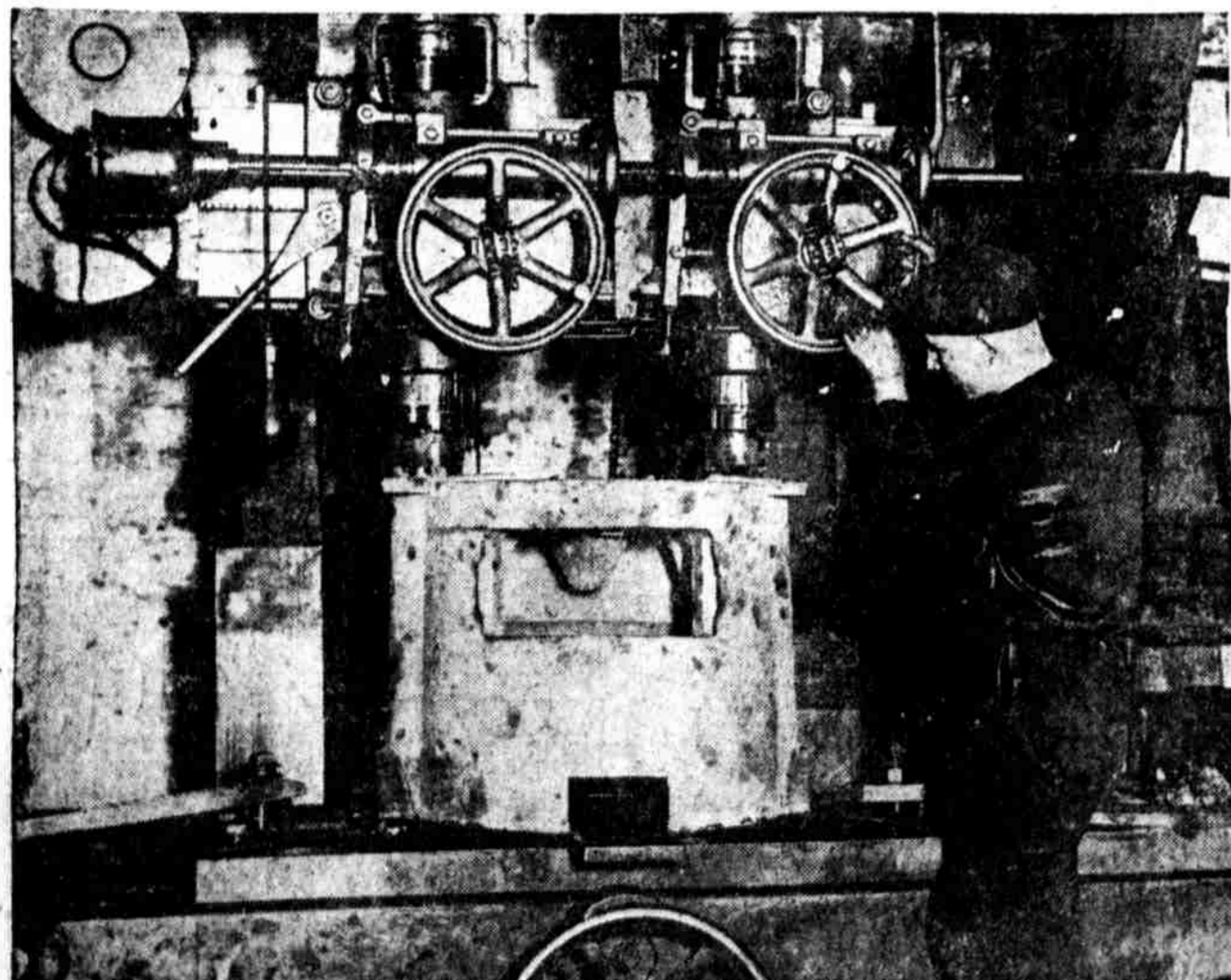
