

ROBBERS SLAY MAN AND WOUND WIFE

Baby Severely Burned When Shots Are Fired in Attempted Hold-Up

TWO ARE UNDER ARREST

A downtown storekeeper was shot and killed, his wife was shot through the arm and their baby received severe powder burns when two negro thieves tried to steal their savings.

The savings represented a fund put away to open a drug store following the man's recent graduation from the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy, and they fought desperately to save them.

The dead man is Richard Manus, thirty-three years old, 2122 South Ninth street. His wife, Bonnie, thirty-two years old, is in a serious condition in St. Agnes's Hospital, suffering more from the shock than her wound.

The baby, Leonard, eighteen months old, is in the hospital. She will recover, Mrs. Manus was carrying the baby when she tried to stop the robbers. The baby was burned by the bullet that wounded her mother.

Earl Carter, nineteen years old, Eleventh street near South, said to be the man who fired the shots, was captured after a terrible struggle. The police whisked him away to keep the crowd from carrying out its threat to lynch him. He is being held without bail to await the action of the coroner.

Lungs at Bandit

Manus and his wife with the baby in his arms, were standing in their store at the South Ninth street address talking over the drug store project about 8:45 o'clock last evening when two negroes entered. A third stayed outside to keep watch.

Manus's only reply to a demand re-enforced by a revolver leveled at his head, that he open the safe and deliver his money was to spring over the counter at the armed bandit.

The bandit shot at Manus leaped, but the proprietor pluckily grappled with the bandit. A second bullet struck him in the arm, and he loosened his hold.

As the two negroes ran toward the

door Mrs. Manus tried to intercept them. She was shot through the arm and the baby was burned. The bullet is not thought to have been fired by the man who shot her husband.

But Manus had pulled himself together and, despite his two wounds, the first of which later caused his death, again grappled with Carter.

Slayer Is Identified

In the fight that ensued he was shot through the abdomen again. But his dying grasp was so strong that Carter was unable to wrench himself free before others arrived on the scene.

Thomas Taylor, a former policeman, and Patrolman Mitchell, of the Fourth street and Snyder avenue station, pronounced upon Carter, and after a sharp fight subdued him.

Then they had more trouble on their hands. A crowd had gathered quickly and a rope had been produced to carry out the threats to "bring him up." A riot squad under Lieutenant Myers arrived just in time to prevent this.

Manus was still alive when he reached the hospital. There he is said to have revived and identified Carter as his assailant. He died shortly after. Carter will be arraigned for murder today.

Alexander Miller, twenty-three years old, another negro, was arrested in Carter's home late last night and held along with Carter. He said he lived on Chestnut street. The third man has not been caught.

The oak is white No. 1, 4 inches thick and of random width from 10 inches up, averaging 13 inches; random length, 9 feet to 16 feet, averaging 13 feet in length. This lumber can be used for boat and shipwright work.
