Sex Variance Feature

The suicide statistics in regard to sex offer another interesting subject of speculation. Sixty-four women took their lives in 1919, in comparison to 137 men. Doctor Leidy believes this difference is due to the more constant mation of women.

"A housewife has little time to spend in brooding." said Doctor Leidy. "The mind of a man who is out of work offers a fertile field for the suggestion that he take his own life.
