

### CARMAN STARTS CAMPAIGN HERE WITH 40-MILE WIN

World's Champion Starts and Finishes Like Real Titleholder  
at Point Breeze—Chapman Rides, Though Ill

CLARENCE CARMAN started and finished like the champion he is in the forty-mile grind, the feature of the bicycle show at the Point Breeze Velodrome last night. The world's titleholder, paced by the peerless Jimmy Hunter, shot out into the lead shortly after the beginning of the pedal-pushing and held the advantage until the final gun.

Reggie McNamara, of Australia, in the professional sprint race, Madden took the event in straight heats. Madden's time for the first mile was 2:30 2-5. He did the second mile in 2:35. The Newark flier did the last lap of his second mile in the speedy time of 16 4-5 seconds.

The forty miles was made in a second and four-fifths over fifty-five minutes. George Wiley, the Syracuse speedster, was close on Carman throughout the entire race. He was never a lap behind and finished second, a trifle over 100 yards in the rear. George Colombatto, the Italian champion, was third, five laps behind Carman.

There were a number of spills in the amateur races, but no one was seriously hurt. There were several bruises and scratches, however. At one time eight of the amateurs went down in a heap together.

George Chapman, the local youth, was unable to finish the race. He was ill before he started, but gamely refused to stay out of the grind. While he was on his thirty-sixth mile he was stricken with a severe case of cramps of the stomach and had to drop out.

Harris Winner  
W. Miller, of Trotter Wheelmen, captured the half-mile novice in 1:07 2-5, which is remarkable time for a beginner. Frank Harris, of the Olympic C. C., put over a victory in the mile-and-out. A. Walters, of the Quaker City C. C., took the one-mile handicap with a start of 225 yards.

Capacity Crowd  
Another capacity crowd was on hand, close to 10,000 witnessing the 1920 bow of Carman. It was announced that Menus Bedell would take another crack at the one-hour record time, which he now holds, tomorrow night in the Rotary grind. Bedell will be opposed by Leon Vanderstuf, the Belgian champion; Oscar Egg, of Switzerland, and Colombatto.
