

### DELAWARE GROWS 20,681 IN DECADE

Entire State Shows Gain of 10.2 Per Cent Since Last Census

Washington, June 28.—Delaware, first state whose total population has been announced in the fourteenth census, had a growth of 20,681, or 10.2 per cent, in the last ten years, making the total population 223,063, the Census Bureau reported today. In the ten years ending with 1910 Delaware increased 17,587, or 9.5 per cent, with a total population of 202,322.

New Castle county, containing more than half the population of the state, had an increase of 25,051, or 20.3 per cent, while the other two counties showed decreases. Wilmington, largest city in the state, made up 22,757 of the increase in New Castle county and jumped into the cities of the 100,000 class with a total population of 110,168, an increase of 26.0 per cent over 1910.

Delaware showed a slower and more irregular growth in the earlier censuses than it has in the later ones. From 1790 to 1810 the absolute increase in population was 13,578, or 23 per cent; from 1810 to 1840 the increase was

5411, or 7.4 per cent. The increase in the fifty years from 1790 to 1840 was 18,089, or 32.1 per cent. During the next fifty years, from 1840 to 1890, the population of the state more than doubled. From 1890 to 1910 the absolute increase was 33,829, or 20.1 per cent. The absolute increase for the ten years ending 1910 nearly equaled the total growth in the population of the state from 1790 to 1840.

Oklahoma City, Okla., has 91,258, an increase of 27,053 or 42.1 per cent; Walla Walla, Wash., 15,503, a decrease of 3801 or 19.9 per cent.

Population of Colorado Springs, Colo., was announced as 30,105 in the preliminary statement on El Paso county, Col., issued today. That is 533 more than the city's population as previously announced, when the total was given as 29,572.

You are not a cub, for if you were you wouldn't have the knowledge and experience that produces sound advertising of the Corman standard.

You aren't very old, for if you were and had the trained ability we need, there would be something wrong with you if you were open for a new job.

You have just arrived at the point where you have reached top form and your present employers are trying to duck the fact on pay day or don't need or know how to treat a first-class man.

We are not going to sweep you off your feet in the matter of salary—just enough to live on decently.

We all earned ours and you are going to earn yours before you get it. I never read a good letter of application, but if you can write one, do so.
