

KENDRICK NOT OUT FOR GOVERNOR YET

Senator Vare Says Receiver of Taxes Will Run for Re-nomination

PRIMARY FIGHT BREWING

W. Freeland Kendrick, receiver of taxes, will be a candidate for re-election next year and is not now a candidate for Governor. A statement to this effect was made today by Senator Vare. The senator's announcement, while dispelling the rumor Mr. Kendrick had announced his candidacy for Governor, is taken to be also an announcement the Vares intend to fight in the primaries of next year when the county offices are to be filled. It is certain the Moore forces will contest every foot of the way with the

Vare leaders in the fight for control of the county offices. The struggle next primary election will center around the nominations for receiver of taxes, register of wills, district attorney and city treasurer. The Vares are in control, politically speaking, of all these, with the exception of the office of district attorney. Mayor Moore feels that county offices under the control of the Vares are a hindrance to his administrative plans. Politicians said the Senator's statement was more important as forecasting another primary fight than of finally answering the question as to the Vare candidate to succeed Governor Sproul. Senator Vare's statement was as follows: "I am fully satisfied Mr. Kendrick never announced his candidacy for Governor. He made a splendid record as receiver of taxes and I am sure that instead of running for Governor he will be a candidate for re-election to his present office and will be re-elected with an overwhelming majority."

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ELLIS A. GIMBEL TO BE HOST

Open-Air Shakespearean Performance at Philmont Country Club. Ellis A.
