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AMERICANS LOSE IN BRITISH GOLF

Duncan Wins Title—Barnes's Total 308 and Walter Hagen's 329

Deal, England, July 1.—George Duncan, the veteran British professional golfer, won the British open championship, concluded today, with a total of 308.

Duncan went to the front by doing the third round in 71 and the final round in 72. Of the two American entrants, Jim Barnes finished with an aggregate of 308 and Walter Hagen with 329.
