

10 MEN MAY ADMIT PHILADELPHIA SOLDIERS' FATHERS

Post Commanders and Adjutants to Discuss Move at Conference Called by Simpson

DAVIS APPROVES THE PLAN

Admission of the fathers of soldiers, sailors and marines who were in the service as honorary members of the ranks of the American Legion will be discussed at a conference of post commanders and post adjutants at the Chamber of Commerce assembly room next Tuesday evening. David B. Simpson, vice commander of the Department of Pennsylvania and commander of Walter M. Gearty Post No. 325, issued the call and will place his suggestion before the representatives of the seventy-eight Philadelphia posts at the instance of David J. Davis, of Beranton, the department commander. This proposal, which will make possible the honorary membership of thousands of men throughout the United States, has the support of Commander Davis because he feels it will bestow a fitting honor on the men who gave their sons in the service and it will also tend to balance the young organization.

Furthermore, the mothers, sisters and widows of former service men are now able to join the women's auxiliaries, so that they have an indirect voice in the work of the organization. The fathers are excluded entirely from participation in its deliberations. It is proposed by Commander Davis that enrollment among the legionaries be tested on this proposition. If the men favor it a recommendation to this effect can be made at the national convention in Cleveland in September. When the county committee meets next Wednesday night consideration will be given to the reorganization of the committee on the basis provided for under the terms of the new constitution. This meeting will be held in the Chamber of Commerce assembly room at 8 o'clock. An urgent request has been made that all the posts be represented, inasmuch as matters of vital importance relative to the future of the legion in Philadelphia county are pending decision by the posts. With the ratification of the new constitution the present county organization will be legislated out of existence and the problem of reorganization of the county in line with the new state document must be solved.

In the event that the requisite three-fifths of the posts representing at least three-fifths of the paid up membership in the county, vote in favor of the organization of a county committee, such an organization will be effected according to the terms of the constitution. The representation in the new committee will be in proportion to the number of paid-up members. The representation of the posts in a county committee will be the same as that in a state cantonment—one representative for each post and an additional representative for each 100 paid-up members.
