

POLICEMEN GIVE KIDS CLIP TO SHAVE HAIRCUT COST

Park Avenue Station House Turned Into Tonsorial Parlor as Officers Aid Neighborhood in Fighting H. C. of L.

The police of the Thirty-ninth district, Park avenue, are cutting the hair of living and the children's hair and having quite a time out at their station house at Twenty-second street and Hunting Park avenue.

The mothers of that locality have been complaining for some time that the barbers charge men's prices—thirty-five cents—to cut the small boys' hair. And thirty-five cents is thirty-five cents in Nicotown, as it is almost anywhere else.

One of the assets of the police station of that district is a good set of clippers that can be used on horses, dogs or men. It is a fast-working, close-cutting contrivance turned by hand and gives a billiard ball finish to the spot treated.

Yesterday afternoon the Thirty-ninth district tonsorial parlor, or clipping studio, or whatever you want to call it, was opened with a rush of long-haired business. The boys of the neighborhood have been crowding the chair ever since, and this morning the Thirty-sixth haircut was rung up. There is no charge and the service is perfect, according to the satisfied families of the customers.

John McAtee is the police barber who swings the clippers and Acting Sergeant William Steble puts the motive power on the wheel. Harry Horrocks handles a hand pump and waves a towel over the bare heads as they come out from under the care of the clipper.
