

**RUSSIANS CONTINUE DRIVE UPON POLAND**

Defenders, Facing Grave Crisis, Beg Every Citizen to Arm

**BOLSHEVIKI CROSS BERESINA**

London, July 8.—Russian Bolsheviki forces have smashed their way forward on the southern flank of the Polish front and Soviet military authorities report success in a series of battles near Staro-Konstantinov, toward which town they are driving the Poles, according to a Bolshevik official statement received here by wireless.

Soviet forces have reached Litichev, twenty-four miles east of Proskirov, and have occupied Mohilev-Podolski in their drive along the Dnieper river.

Heavy fighting is going on between the bolshevik and forces commanded by General Wrangel, on the southern front, the struggle being particularly intense in the region of Orichkov, the statement says.

Warsaw, July 8.—(By A. P.)—Bolshevik troops after several fruitless attempts, have succeeded in effecting a crossing of the Beresina in a strong force near Navosialki, southeast of Borisov, about fifty miles northeast of Minsk, it was announced in today's Polish official communique.

A smaller detachment forced the Beresina south of Beresina village, farther to the southeast.

Owing to the critical position of the country, volunteers for active service in the army are offering themselves from every side. They include school and university teachers, students, Boy Scouts, civil servants and ministerial employees whose occupations excuse them from military service. The students are enlisting in such numbers that the Warsaw universities have been closed.

Stirred by the appeal of the National Council of Defense for volunteers, hundreds of girls and women have taken initial steps to join the army. Yesterday uniformed women soldiers, with women officers, paraded the streets singing, and for the first time Warsaw saw detachments of female recruits under the guidance of women officers marching to the barracks.

Many of the recruits were strong girls in short skirts and shirtwaists with braided hair hanging down their backs. The sight of female recruits aroused enthusiasm everywhere along the principal streets. Mixed with the girl recruits were women of from twenty-five to thirty years who swung parasols, purses and market packages in arms which will soon carry rifles.

The women's battalions will be used chiefly for guard duty in garrisons and head depots and as train escorts, thus relieving men for the front lines.

The Socialist party central committee today issued the following proclamation:

"When the Polish troops were advancing we demanded peace, but now we ought to defend ourselves firmly. We appeal to the soldiers to fulfill their duty in defense of the country against the invader. The government, however, ought to give guarantees that it desires peace, declare to the world that Poland desires a just peace and address to the soviet government proposals for peace negotiations."

ports of the capture of Rovno, one of the three famous fortresses in western Russia by the Bolsheviki, are confirmed by a Polish official statement issued yesterday and received here today.

Berlin, July 8.—The Polish front from the Pripiet to the Carpathians has completely collapsed, and the situation is most serious, the semi-official Allgemeine Zeitung says it learns authoritatively. The Russian push southward from Kiev and Rovno has met with only slight opposition.

**MISS MORGAN TO WED**

Daughter of U. S. High Commissioner to Belgium Only 17

New York, July 8.—News reached New York yesterday from Paris of the engagement of Miss Consuelo Morgan, daughter of Mr. Harry H. Morgan, United States commissioner to Belgium, and Mrs. Morgan, to Count Jean De Maunpus du Juglart, of Paris. The marriage will take place in St. Pierre de Chailot today. Miss Morgan, who is seventeen years old, went to the French capital last March to continue her studies and was to have been introduced to society next winter.

In June Mrs. Morgan and her daughter were introduced to the Belgian court at a drawing room in the palace at Brussels and afterward attended a royal garden party. Miss Morgan is a granddaughter on her mother's side of General Kilpatrick, one time ambassador to Chile, and Mr. Philip Hicky Morgan, at one time Judge of the Supreme Court of Louisiana, and Judge of the International Court in Egypt.

Count De Maunpus, son of Count and Countess De Maunpus du Juglart, of Rue de Longchamp, Paris, is thirty years old. He is a member of an ancient French family that has flourished since the eleventh century. He was one of the first Frenchmen to join his country's colors in the world war. A private he was severely wounded and his fighting career cut short. He was captured and taken to Germany, where he remained in a prison camp four years. His brother was killed in the war.

Private Shops in Moscow Shut  
Moscow, June 17.—(By A. P.)—All private enterprises not operating upon a purely co-operative basis have been closed, as the first step by Moscow authorities in a vigorous fight against speculation. Traffic in cosmetics and toilet articles will be nationalized. Shopkeepers, including proprietors of restaurants, have received notice their shops are subject to closure.

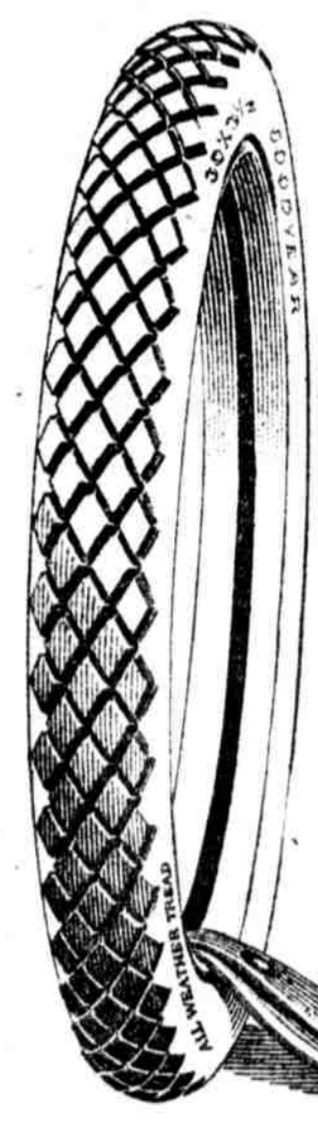

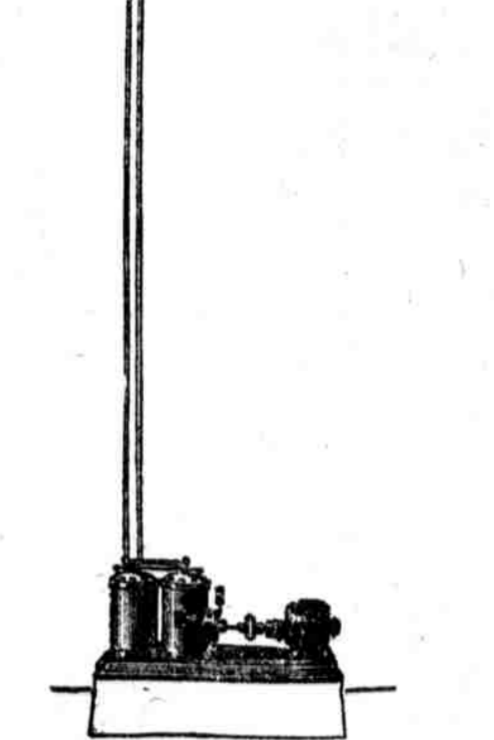
