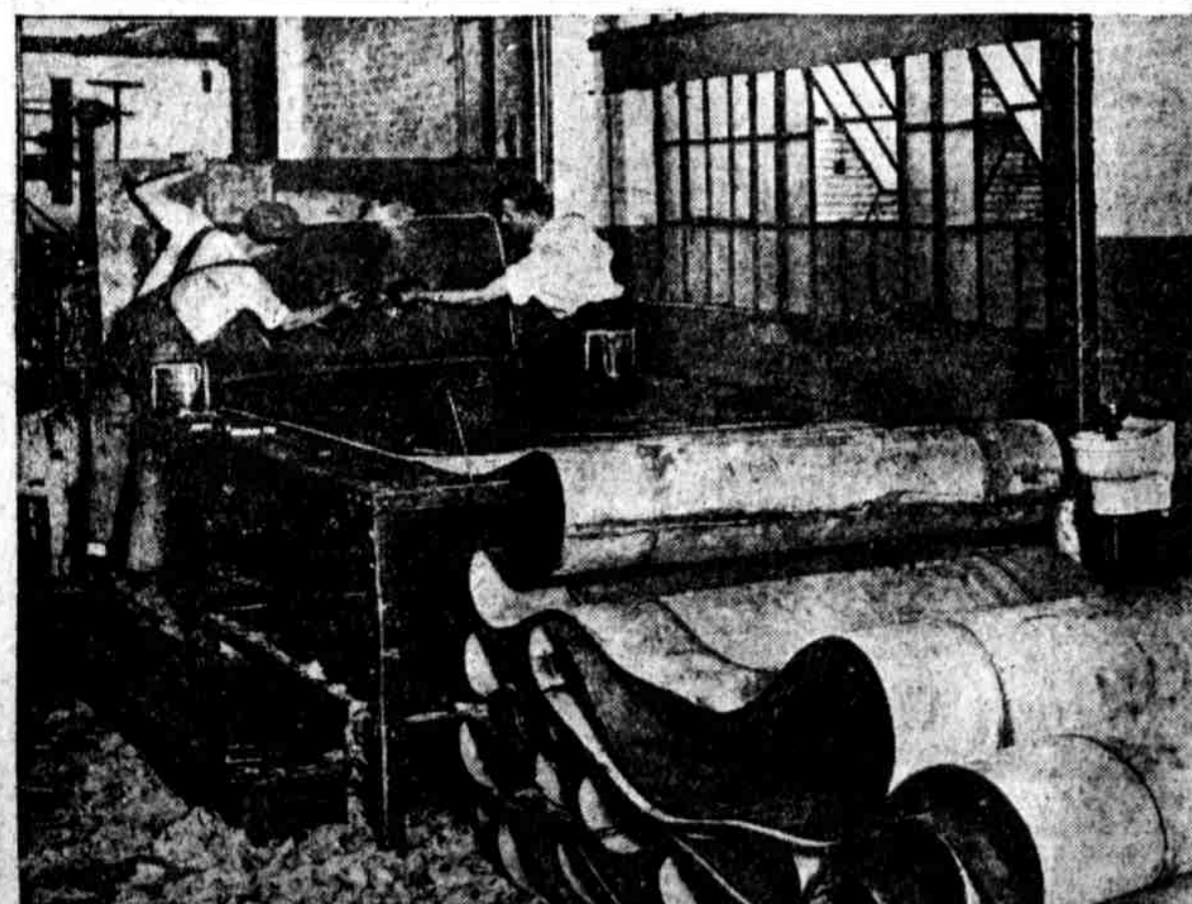


NEW BRITISH CONSUL GENERAL at his desk. Gerald Campbell has been appointed to succeed Thomas P. Porter in Philadelphia.

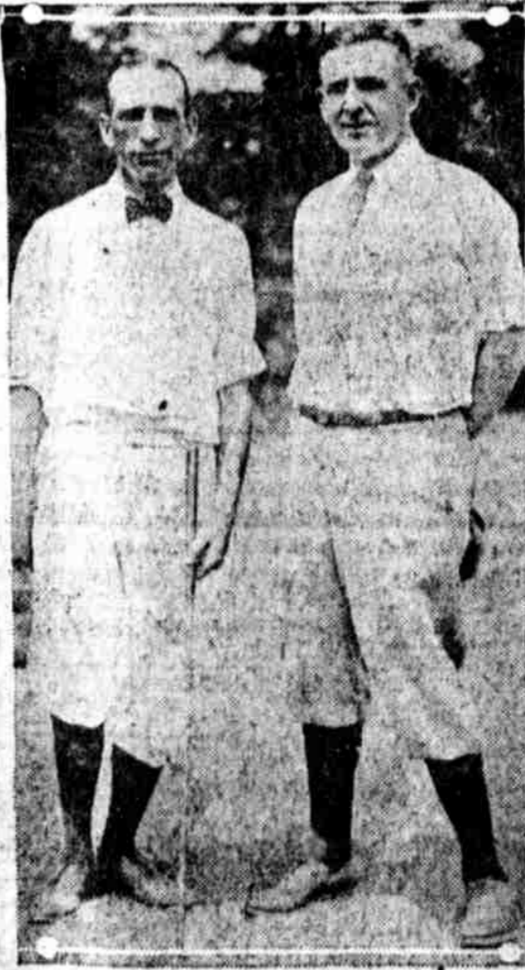

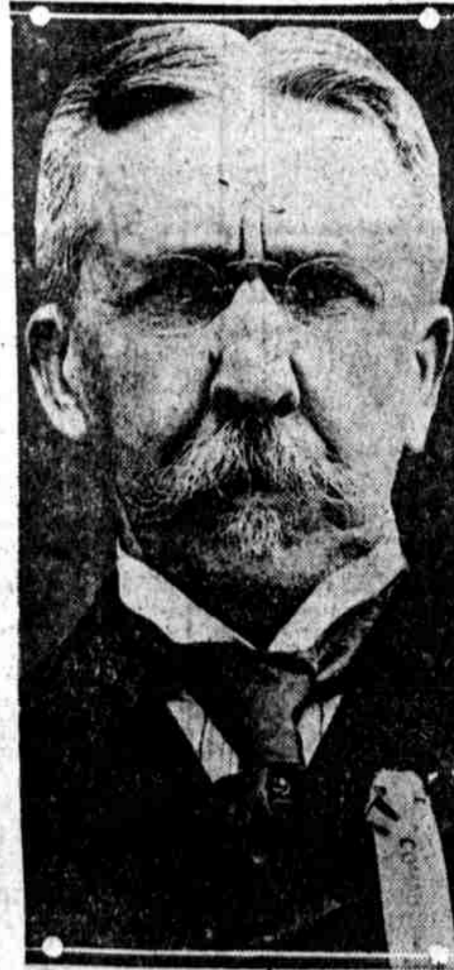
