

ARMY SOLDIERS IN FIRST REUNION

Men of 304th Ammunition Train, 79th Division, to Gather Tomorrow at Berwyn

Men of the 304th Ammunition Train, Seventy-ninth Division, will hold their first reunion tomorrow at Chesterbrook Farm, the country place of Colonel E. M. Cassatt, at Berwyn, Pa. This division returned to America on Oct. 1, 1919, and this will be the first time the boys of the train have been able to get together and talk over old times. More than 400 have already accepted the invitations. They will be on hand from Connecticut, Maryland, Delaware, New Jersey and other points. Most of the enlisted personnel were selected men from Philadelphia, Montgomery and Chester counties.

The ammunition train has a brilliant record in the fight at St. Mihiel and the imperishable glory in the Meuse-Argonne during the capture of Montfaucon.

Decided to Form Association
When the boys came over on the transport Minnesota they determined before landing at Charleston, according to Major Vincent A. Carroll, to form a regimental association. This, then, will

be the big business of the gathering tomorrow. The new organization will be affiliated with the Seventy-ninth Division Association, which has headquarters in the Liberty Building, this city. According to Major Carroll, it has been very difficult to get into touch with all the men of the train, as so many have been forced to change their addresses, owing to the increased cost of living and the general housing problem. Any man of the train, however, said the major, whether he received an invitation or not, will be given a royal welcome at the big blowout.

There will be other things besides the organization meeting, which will take but a little while. Games and sports of all kinds have been provided for. The boys will talk over events between the sailing of the train from Philadelphia on July 13, 1918, on the Haverford until its return. Old buddies will want to hunt each other up, and the sets will be a big feature.

Served Together Continuously
The men of the train served together continuously from the time of its organization at Camp Meade until they

were mustered out of the service. The first drafted men to arrive at Camp Meade were sent to this train. Colonel Walter E. Prosser was the first commanding officer of the regiment.
