**FOODSTUFF PRICES INCREASE IN JUNE**

Philadelphia One of Few Cities to Show Decline in Living Costs

H. C. L. HIGH AT DETROIT

Washington, July 20.—Retail food prices continue to show a "steady increase," according to a survey of the food budget of the average family for June, made public today by the bureau of statistics of the Department of Labor. An advance of 2 per cent was noted on June 15 over prices on the same day the month before. This was an increase of 9 per cent since the first of the year.

Prices increased in thirty-nine cities under observation and decreased in twelve. Increases observed were 5 per cent in Detroit, Omaha and Portland, Ore.; 4 per cent in Boston, Indianapolis, Kansas City, Manchester, Scranton, Seattle and Springfield, Ill.; 3 per cent in Bridgeport, Buffalo, Chicago, Denver, Milwaukee, Peoria, Pittsburgh, Portland, Me., St. Louis and St. Paul; 2 per cent in Cleveland, Columbus, Fall River, Minneapolis, Newark, New York and Providence, and 1 per cent in Birmingham, Los Angeles, Louisville, Memphis, New Haven, Richmond, Salt Lake City and San Francisco. In Baltimore and Washington the increase was less than 1 per cent. A decrease of 5 per cent was noted in Houston, Tex.; 3 per cent in Jacksonville, Fla.; 2 per cent in Atlanta and Mobile, Ala.; 1 per cent in Cincinnati, Little Rock, New Orleans and Norfolk and less than five-tenths of 1 per cent in Dallas, Philadelphia and Savannah.

The greatest increase in the last year of 29 per cent was shown in Springfield, Ill., and the lowest, 8 per cent, in Charleston, S. C. Only two cities—Portland, Me., and St. Paul—showed a decrease of 5 per cent. In Detroit, which topped the list with an increase of 130 per cent.
