Can Carry Out Coal Agreement, German Foreign Minister Declares

Berlin, July 21.—The present German Government intends to carry out the agreements entered into with the Allies at Spa, Dr. Walter Simons, the foreign minister, declared in an interview granted the newspaper correspondents here today.

in their threats to occupy more German territory. Count Sforza, the Italian foreign minister, left him in no doubt that the threatened French occupation would be supported by all the Entente powers in the event of Germany not fulfilling her obligations, Doctor Simons asserted.

The German delegates, however, he added, would not have signed the agreement if they had not been convinced that the coal demands by all the Entente were capable of fulfillment.

Doctor Simons told the correspondents that legitimate traffic in coal was taking place and that large quantities of Ruhr coal had been discovered in places not on the official plan.
