

FAMILY IS DRIVEN TO STREET BY FIRE

Mother and 3 Children Awakened by Flames—Escape in Nightclothes

A mother and her three children were driven from their home in their night-

clothes at 2 o'clock this morning during a fire in the home of Mrs. Rose Goldstein, at 947 South Fifth street. Mrs. Goldstein and her children were asleep on the second floor of the house and were not awakened until the flames were almost upon them. The fire was discovered by a pedestrian. It had gained considerable headway, and was sweeping through the eaves of the building just over the heads of the sleeping family. The man who discovered the blaze gave the alarm, and then aroused members of the household. Mrs. Goldstein's son, Morris, assisted his mother down the smoke-filled stairway, and returned to the burning building to aid his sisters, Lillian and Bonnie, to safety. The cause of the fire is not known.
