

ALL LEGION UNITS TO BE INSPECTED

Vice Department Commander Will Examine Them Before Deputy Takes Up Work

David B. Simpson, vice department commander of the American Legion, will visit all posts in Philadelphia to learn their general condition. This supervision by the vice department commander will be of importance in advance of the appointment of a deputy department commander for Philadelphia.

When the new deputy commander is named by Commander David J. Davis, it will be his duty to inspect posts and recommend whether their present charters be continued or certain amalgamations be effected. He will undoubtedly experience difficulty in effecting consolidations, as similar efforts by district representatives of the county committee failed in many instances.

SHORE TRAINS DELAYED

Derailing of Empty Cars in Camden Ties Up Traffic

Traffic on the Atlantic City, Long Branch and Trenton branches of the West Jersey and Seashore Railroad out of Camden was delayed early this morning by the derailing of two passenger cars at the entrance to the Camden terminal. As a result many commuters on the early trains from points in South Jersey were late arriving at their places of employment, as trains were held up while the tracks were cleared. No one was hurt.

The derailed cars were part of a trainload of "empties" that were being

"drilled" in the yards preparatory to being run into the terminal to make up one of the regular trains. The cars went off the tracks at a switch near Second street. Traffic was moving normally within an hour.
