

ACCORDO TRA ITALIA ED ALBANIA
La Questione di Valona Sarebbe Risolta con Privilegi a Favore dell'Italia

Londra, 4 agosto.—L'accordo sul quale pendevano le trattative tra l'Italia e l'Albania è stato finalmente firmato, secondo un telegramma giunto all'Exchange Telegraph da Roma, dove la notizia sarebbe stata comunicata con un dispaccio da Valona. L'Italia, si dice, avrebbe rinunciato ai Capli Linguetta e Trefordi.

Londra, 3 agosto.—Un dispaccio giunto all'Exchange Telegraph da Roma recita che secondo notizie giunte da Valona un accordo tra l'Italia e l'Albania sarebbe firmato oggi.

Un telegramma giunto pure da Roma al London Times dice che il giornale d'Italia annuncia che l'accordo direbbe l'isola di Sasano e l'Italia, al nord della baia di Valona sull'Adriatico, ed il diritto di fortificare i Capli Linguetta e Trefordi, dando all'Italia un porto legittimo sul mare e il diritto di fortificare il porto e il diritto di fortificare le mura.

Dal lato militare l'Italia avrebbe liberato di azione non casuale, ma una qualche azione mirante a Valona o l'integrità dell'Albania.

Parigi, 3 agosto.—Vi è speranza che un accordo tra l'Italia e la Grecia, relativamente alla questione delle isole del Dodocaneso, sia raggiunto in tempo per firmare il trattato di pace con la Trachina senza ritardo e cioè "giovedì", secondo quanto annuncia il giornale "Le Temps".

Sembra che il Governo Italiano sia disposto presentemente a cedere alla Grecia tutte le isole, tranne quelle del Dodocaneso, chiedendo solamente una modificazione seconda la quale per disporre dell'isola di Rodi l'Italia tenesse un plebiscito.

Roma, 3 agosto.—Dispacci giunti da Valona recano che le truppe italiane sono pronte per respingere qualsiasi attacco disperato da parte delle forze albanesi. Si ritiene che un conflitto sia inevitabile e che potrà avvenire da un momento all'altro. Il morale delle truppe italiane è alto, contrariamente alle aspettative degli anarchici, i quali hanno sperato e credono di demoralizzare lo spirito dei soldati con la loro nefasta propaganda.

Il Governo ha diramato un comunicato ufficiale con il quale smentisce la recente notizia, diramata all'estero da un'agenzia ufficiosamente, che le truppe italiane erano state costrette a ritirarsi da Valona in seguito a una grave sconfitta loro inflitta dai ribelli albanesi.

Il comunicato osserva che la notizia non avrebbe avuto l'importanza di un smentita, se all'estero non l'avessero presa sul serio accendendole immediata diffusione. Sta di fatto invece che nessun combattimento si è verificato a Valona dal 28 luglio, quando, mediante attacco notturno, i ribelli tentarono di sorprendere i presidii italiani sulla linea di Valona-Kanina. Il tentativo risultò in senso sanguinoso per gli assalitori, i quali probabilmente si sono convinti che contro il campo di Valona non sono possibili sorprese notturne o diurne.

VETERANS IN WAR ON LIQUOR

A number of patients at the sanitarium, tubercular from the effects of being gassed, have been made drunk recently by the illicit dealers in liquor.
