Hughes.

"Demonstrations in America favorable to Archbishop Mannix," said Mr. Hughes. "were carefully stage managed in a manner similar to that pursued in those arranged in Australia, and the people who acclaimed him there were Sinn Feiners, possibly leavened with Bolsheviki or other wild fanatics. Archbishop Mannix does not represent Australia on the Irish or any other question, and is the acknowledged Sinu Fein leader in this country. l'ein leader in this country.

"When he arrived in Australia seven years ago." Lie premier continued. "Australia was freer from sectarian hitteness than any country in the world. Spurred by boundless personal ambition and hatred of Great Britain. Archbishop Mannix has fanned the dring embers of religious bigotry into some blaze gethering around him. a fierce blaze, gathering around him every fanatic alien and Sinn Feiner in the country. He worked incessantly during the war to prevent recruiting and help the enemy defeat the Allies, working great harm to Australia."


